Joseph Field being of sound & perfect mind & memory do make & publish this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following first I want all my last debts & funeral Expences paid out of personal property that is I want my Wife & all the Negroes sold in a twelve month Credit also my yearling Cows my old mare & three head of Cow-beasts & my smith tools & the money arising from the sale thereof to be appropriated to use above mentioned. Secondly I give & bequeath to my Wife Lotta Field a Certain tract or parcel of land lying in Mecklenburg County beginning as follows Beginning on a Walnut in William Watsons line thence North to a Branch thence down the said Branch to the mouth of the same Branch thence up the same Branch to the head of said Branch thence a South East Course 200 to a stake thence East to a stake so as to leave forty rods between it & John Fortins line - thence South to a stake on Roberts line - thence west to the beginning to have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of land during her widowhood or her natural life time & after her death the land to belong to my daughter Deborah Field after paying my son Joel Field one hundred dollars in property at trade rate thirdly I give & bequeath to my son John Field a Certain tract or parcel of Land lying in the County aforesaid Beginning on the aforesaid Walnut running West with Lottas line to a Hickory corner - thence North with the old line to a pine corner thence East along the old line to the corner of the plantation thence South with the fence forty four rods thence East twenty rods thence South to the same Branch to have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land & the aforesaid
