A. R. Turk's Will Recorded

State of Seneca County being well apprised of the uncertainty of all human existences and the great propriety of making some disposition of my estate, I make this my last will, Revoking all others, First I give to my wife Gincy Turk all my property both real and personal during her life or widowhood, earnestly requesting that she shall not marry, at her death or marriage my negroes Noy, Nalinda, George and Betty with their bodily issue to be at her disposal if the laws of the Country will admit, if not to be placed in a condition that will approach the same as near as possible accompanied with support for such as may be infirm. Secondly I wish an Inventory taken of all my property with its reasonable value, and registered my landed property including Town lots in the Town of Calhoun, Together with my farming utensils and Tools of all description, and all my live stock of every kind whatever except such part of my landed estate as my wife Gincy Turk may think proper to reserve for her accommodations, also such part of live stock as she may think proper to reserve. The balance except my negroes and such house hold property as my wife may wish to keep the balance to be sold in any manner my executors may think best taking all care to preserve the same. The money arising from all such sales over and above the necessities of my wife Gincy Turk to be vested in Bank or Rail Road stock as my executors may think best or to such private characters as my executors may think proper, well securing the debt upon six per cent per annum. Third at the death or marriage of my wife Gincy Turk or sooner if she should choose she may give such dividend to my legatees herein after mentioned as she may think proper previous to her death, and at her death my will is that my estate of every description whatever (except my negroes) heretofore mentioned shall be divided equally between her and her heirs except our wearing clothes which is to be entirely at the disposal of my wife, and such other personal family property not exceeding two hundred dollars which are also at the disposal of my wife.

Fourth I hereby make and constitute Samuel Workman my niece Rebecca Griffith, Laura Griffith my nephew Mary Jane, both my nieces

Archibald R. S. Hambright & Archibald R. Turk sons of William Turk my Brother my legal and lawful Legates to receive all the benefits of this will in manner and form as before specified. Fifth It is my wish and earnest request that Alexander McKays and Samuel Workman should act as my executors, and in the event they should refuse that the proper Court would appoint suitable persons taking the obligations the law requires to execute this, Will and Testament. I, Elijah Hurst do make and ordain this my last will and Testament 1st It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid 2nd I give and bequeath to my son Rufus R. Hurst my negro boy Harry during his life; and at his death it is my will and desire that said boy Harry go to his heirs 3rd I will and bequeath to my son John L. Hurst my negro boy Jeff during his life; and at his death I give and bequeath said boy Jeff to his heirs 4th I will and bequeath to my son Rufus my Cate tract of land during his life; and at his death I desire the same to go to the heirs of said Rufus; and in consideration thereof he is to pay a debt I am owing the Banks for said tract of land 5th It is my will and desire that my executor maintain my negro woman Rachel when her tenth child shall have attained the age of ten years; and it is my wish that she remain in McMind County and that my executors support her out of my estate when she gets too old to support herself. 6th I will and bequeath to my wife Mary the following negroes during her natural life, viz. Peter, Austin, Tom, Nancy, Jude and Jerry; and at her death I wish them equally divided among my four children and I will and bequeath to my dear wife Mary all my household and kitchen furniture, and such of my farming utensils as my executors may think necessary for her convenience, together with all my stock of horses, cattle, and hogs 7th I will and bequeath to my daughter Lucretia Eliza and her heirs forever the four negroes she has had possession of, viz. Amy, Jude, Sam and Matilda; together with all the other property I have given her. 8th It is my wish that my daughter Sarah and Calloway have and enjoy all the property conveyed hitherto in trust for her benefit, and I will and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Ann Calloway my Barouch Carriage and harness in consideration of some boxes Calloway sustained on my account 9th It is my wish and desire that my executors get my Mother and Sister Delilah to remove from Claiborne County to the County of McMind, and that they attend to them carefully; for that trouble and for taking care of my dear wife Mary, I have given them Harry & Jeff 10th It is my will and desire hereby to leave my son Rufus R. Hurst from all debts and accounts he is owing me, on condition that he attends to the interest of my wife until she dies.

11th It is my will and desire that nothing be suspended in this my last will and Testament to interrupt the partnership existing between my son John L. Hurst and myself until the five years have expired 12th I do hereby constitute and appoint my two sons Rufus R. Hurst and John L. Hurst my executors of this my last will and Testament, and do authorize and desire that they should act without giving bond and security for the trust reposed, signed, sealed, published and declared to be my last will and Testament this 12th day of December 1844

I do make and publish this, as my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all other Wills, by me at any time made.
