I, John Shelby of Montgomery County Tennessee calling to mind the uncertainty of death & the uncertainty of the time thereof, do make public & declare this my last will & Testament.

In the first place I desire my Executors pay all my just debts, out of my funds on hand at the time of my death. Item I give and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Shelby my four negroes Mic, Judy, Peter & Pat together with Ten milk cows, and calves, one breeding mare, two work horses and one fifth part of all my household & kitchen furniture & farming utensils to her, her heirs and assigns forever, & I desire my executors lay off & settle about as much of the crops & provisions on hand at the time of my death, for the use of my said wife, as will support her one year, decently, I also give & bequeath my said wife the land & plantation whereon I now live, together with six negroes, such as my executors may nominate, to her during her natural life or so long as she remains my widow, & at her death or marriage said lands & six negroes to be equally divided amongst my three children, Alfred M. Shelby, Louisa L. Brunson, & Clark M. Shelby, and if my said wife be living my widow at the time my youngest son Clark M. Shelby arrives at the age of twenty one, my will and desire is that said last mentioned six negroes be equally divided between my said children, but if my said wife should be living my widow at the time of said son Clark arriving at the age of twenty one, and the property which I have devised her should be considered by my Executors inadequate for the support & maintenance of her, I will and desire that each of my three children pay her annually such sum or sums, of money as will be sufficient in addition to what she may hope to support and maintain her decently, the amount to be paid her by each of my children to be fixed and judged or determined by my Executors.

Item, I give & bequeath unto my two sons - Alfred M. Shelby and Clark M. Shelby my two tracts of land, one on the West fork of Red River known by name of Shelby's Quarter containing

about twenty five hundred acres, to be equally divided by my Executors according to quantity of quantity my son Alfred to have his choice of said division, the other tract being and being in Stewart County, on the head waters of the Sandy fork of Red River and large creek containing about twenty three hundred and seventy acres, I desire be divided in the same manner by my Executors, and after said division, that my three Executors William C. Jamison Henry A. Bryan & Anthony B. Shelby make each of half of said twenty three hundred & seventy acres of land for my son Clark M. Shelby, I also give & bequeath unto my said son Clark two thousand dollars, to be loaned out at interest in some bank or other safe hands by my Executors, for the support & Education of my said son.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my daughter Louisa L. Brunson my tract of land on Blooming Grove containing about six hundred acres, or a tract of land in Stewart County containing about five hundred forty five acres one or the other of them at the election of her then husband Jesse A. Brunson to her, her heirs & assigns forever.

Item, I will & desire that all my property both real & personal not herein before devised be equally divided, by a majority of my executors between my three children Alfred M. Shelby, Louisa L. Brunson, & Clark M. Shelby, share & share alike, and should any of my said children die without issue of their body lawfully begotten my will & desire is that the share or proportion of such one dying be equally divided between the survivors.

Item I hereby nominate and appoint my Nephew Anthony B. Shelby Guardian to my son Clark M. Shelby.

Lastly I hereby nominate and appoint my friends William C. Jamison, & Henry A. Bryan, together with my Nephew Anthony B. Shelby, my son Alfred M. Shelby, executors of this my last will & Testament, annulling all former wills by me made In Testimony Whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name & affixed my Seal this 11<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year 1817 & 22<sup>nd</sup> year of our Independence.
