I R. P. Galt being weak in body but of reasonable mind and memory do publish this my last will and testament after revoking all other wills made by me heretofore, and all of my children being of lawful age, and as it respects my personal property, including horses, cattle, sheep and hogs, farming utensils, including my wagon and gearing and household and kitchen furniture also my library of books to be equally divided between my children. I give and bequeath to my wife Rachel one hundred dollars out of a note I hold on for A. Childress. The farm I live on I give to my son Childress the proceeds of the same to be equally divided between them or I will that the land be kept in the family and the heirs to sell or buy to one or another of my children as it may suit their convenience except the seventy six and a half acre tract I bought of Henry Brantstetter I give and bequeath that to my unfortunate son James so long as he lives for his use and benefit and when he dies I will it to revert back to the balance of my children. I also appoint my son

Harvey his Guardian, to see that he is provided for the said farm as the old Galt farm my part of the same being one hundred twenty acres I also give and bequeath to my children. I also will that my wife Rachel have a good and ample support out of the proceeds of my two farms as so long as she remains my widow, as it respects my notes and judgments I wish to be collected as soon as practicable and be equally divided between my children after all of my just debts being paid. The Last Will & Testament

of Reuben Hicks Decd

I know all men by these presents that I Reuben Hicks being of perfect mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made

First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any money that I may be possessed of or may first come into the hands of my executor.

Secondly I will and bequeath to my wife enough of my household property means and effects sufficient to do her amply during her natural life and while she remains my widow

Thirdly I will and bequeath to my oldest son A. J. Hicks the farm or tract of land on which he now lives known as the Glover tract with every thing thereunto belonging or appertaining

Fourthly I will and bequeath to my two sons John C. Hicks and William C. Hicks together the farm on which I now

live with all the buildings appurtenances fixtures & farming implements. Hogs Cattle, sheep and all the stock that I may be possessed of except that which is otherwise disposed of or directed and ordered hereafter or hereafter in this will, and that they divide the land between themselves, if they can agree and if they cannot divide it, then it is my will to have Commissioners appointed, and sworn to divide it for them according to quantity and quality, taking into consideration Buildings improvements &c and also out of my personal property that each of the above named of my sons have a good Bed and flat clothing each.

Fifthly, I will and bequeath to my youngest daughter Malinda Hicks, one bag, Filly, and one Hundred Dollars in cash and an equal part of the house held jointly with the heirs at home, (to wit) John E. N. Co. & Mary Hicks my wife and that she live with her mother until she marries or till the death of her mother.

Sixthly, I will and bequeath unto my two daughters Sarah W. Barry and Mary Ann Barry each as follows: To Sarah W. Barry Two hundred and fifty Dollars, and to Mary Ann Barry One Hundred and fifty Dollars, and that John E. and William C. Hicks pay to each of my daughters the amount of money set to their names and willed by me to them in the time of four years after my death, and lastly I will and bequeath to my Grandson William Jacob Hicks Ten Dollars: And appoint my two sons William C. and John E. Hicks my Executors, In Witness whereof I do to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal, this the 6th day of May 1869

3rd big kettles, one big pot, all of my wearing clothes, the stove and all that belongs to it, one bed room that was Mary Lamron's good table, one old table one chest of drawers, three big wheels, two little wheels, two new saws & cut, one hand saw, all that I
