

The Last will of Isaac Minnie died. Ordered to be recorded

 Know all men that an agreement
 is entered into this day for the follow-
 ing condition

I Samuel minister of said County & my son Isaac of said County, have this day, agreed to commit it to writing and have same go to record to stand unless we the said parties should hereafter both agree to rescind and release ourselves, from this obligation.

Isaac humbly binds himself to take his father and mother to his own house and provide for their maintenance as well as his Circumstances will allow, and treat them in a kind and parental manner during their natural lives. Samuel Minick agrees on his part to set out and convey to Isaac in remuneration for said undertaking my mule (a mare) a cow, all my household and kitchen furniture of every description, also he is to have the house and lot on which I now reside consisting of three acres and one half in one tract, and adjoining the same in one other lot purchased from Elias Leroy. Containing one quarter acre more or less and bounded on the north by Samuel Rhein-land, South by Elias Leroy east by Saut Rhein, West by R. M. Smith & S. M. Lester lots of land. This conveyance includes the lot of ground and house in which D. H. Ernst now lives in which Simon Minick has an interest to the amount of about fifteen Dollars.

All of said property described herein I deliver to said Isaac Minick upon the conditions above stated.

I want it distinctly understood that all the property heretofore enumerated as well as all other property and interests that I may be possessed of at this time is to be and remain the property of my son Isaac, if he performs his part of this agreement faithfully. The amount which the County may hereafter provide to go to my support so far as it will avail. In testimony we have each signed this agreement on this 22^d day of May A.D. 1879

Thirdly I will to my son Robert Dick all the money that
I loan to him for his expenses that he has had and
incurred within in taking care of me whilst alive, except
one hundred and twenty dollars that I loan him
who is in three notes the said note is to be equally
divided between all of the above named heirs except my
son Robert Dick my son Robert Dick is to have the
young horse I bought for carrying of expenses of the house
I will that my Grand daughter Margaret Brown
have one of my single Counties and my Grand daughter
Susan Dick have one of my single Counties
I will to all my within named sons a County for a
piece except Jacob and Michael's for two Counties
is to be sold and the money paid to Jacob and Michael's
heirs I will that the remainder of my property with
specific be sold and equally divided among the within
named heirs to wit George Dick Mary Taylor Margaret
Smith William Dick Samuel Dick David Dick Robert J.
Dick and Jacob and Michael Dicks heirs
Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint George Dick my
sole my executor in witness whereof I do this my will

In the name of God Amen I Josiah Woods of the State of
 Tennessee Sullivan County, being for a long time now in health
 but of sound mind and memory, and calling to mind
 the mortality of my body, that all must die do make
 this instrument of writing my last will and testament
 in the following manner to wit

1st I recommend my spirit to God who made it and my
 body to be by my friends buried in a respectable manner
 2nd I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife the oldest
 Gray mare and two other work horses, 3 choice Cows and
 Calves two yearlings Calves six choice killing hogs 2 brei-
 ing sows and 12 choice all the sheep waggon teams
 and all the farming utensils all the beds bedding
 Bridle and saddle & all my tools & tackings all the
 spinings, wheels large and small and the chest with all
 the Cabbages 2 Chaffpans one meat barrel 2 vinegar Cags
 or barrels household and kitchen furniture beds headsteds and
 all the bed clothing all the chairs & lock cupboard heavy
 book Case Table all the basin books all the grain that
 is raising and on hand all the hay and flax, log chain
 hand saw 2 augers one chisle candle stand flax beat
 detaching short wind mill all the plank and scuffling
 cutting box rife all the poultry 2 fat Cows five short
 sills & cradle moving with the above named property
 is to be for the sole use of my beloved wife and family
 during her natural life or widowhood If my wife should
 marry she is to have a child's part if not marry I want my
 property that is still left at her death to be divided between

my Children equally after giving them their outfit

3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary, married one
 saddle & bridle 1 Cow 1 pair of bedsteads worth 5 dollars

4th I give to my son one saddle & bridle one Cow & heifer one
 pair bedsteads worth 5 dollars

5 I give Martha Ann one saddle & bridle one pair of bedsteads
 worth 5 dollars

6th I give Mammat E. one saddle & bridle one Cow & heifer one
 pair bedsteads worth 5 dollars

7th I give Julia one saddle
 & bridle one Cow or heifer one pair bedsteads worth 5 dollars

8th I give and bequeath unto Amanda M. one saddle & bridle
 one Cow or heifer also pair bedsteads worth 5 dollars all

the property that is not mentioned I want sold and in the
 first place and all my just debts paid and if any there

any money left after paying my debts I want it to
 be divided equally between my heirs as they become of lawful

age Lastly I want my wife while she remains my widow
 to have her home & support off of the plantation and after

her death is she married I will the plantation equally
 between my two youngest girls namely Julia A. Woods

and Amanda M. Woods by paying unto each of these
 ladies fifty dollars each namely Mary M. Woods fifty

dollars unto Isaac M. Woods fifty dollars Martha A.
 Woods fifty dollars and Mammat E. Woods fifty dollars

the payments to be made in good trade at cash price
 at the end of twelve months after then get possession

of the land I nominate and appoint my esteemed friend Eli A.
 Kew executor of this my will to carry the same into

effect
