16. Sixteenth. I hereby revoke all previous Wills & Codicils heretofore made by me.

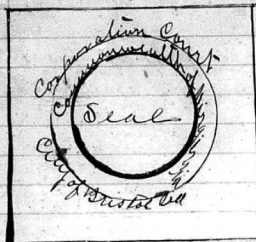
