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1. The State of Kentucky on the estate of Anthony Green except fifty dollars is now due to the
 given to my wife Jane when my youngest daughter is of age which said I will now agree to be paid at
 a year from which my executor are to be the larger the money to be loaned at interest & be divided
 both principal & interest equally between those my four daughters giving to each an equal share
 of the principal & interest remaining at the time she comes to be of age —
 5th. I give & bequeath to my two sons Samuel Harvey & John Newton Doak the rest and
 remainder of my personal goods cattle chattels of White Race & White lower after all my lawful
 debts are paid to be divided equally between them. For & in consideration of what I have given them
 in education & real & personal estate I appoint over and require them the said Samuel Harvey Doak
 and John Newton Doak to provide jointly & equally for the support & support for my wife Jane
 and support for my other children together in the house in which I now live until they come to be of age
 and give to my two sons Samuel Alexander & James Witherspoon a liberal education at Wash
 ington College and give to each of them my two youngest sons when he comes to be of age a horse worth
 in value eighty dollars a saddle & bridle and thirty dollars in cash and a coat & full suit of
 clothing and moreover that those my two sons Samuel Harvey & John Newton pay to each of my
 four daughters Sophia Ester Montgomery Jane & Eliza Smith to pay jointly & equally to each of
 them in trade value at trade value a sum which wife together with her portion of the proceeds of the
 Kentucky land make the sum of two thousand dollars to her when she comes to be of age —
 6th. Wife & bequeath to my two sons Samuel Harvey & John Newton the rest of my own
 land above mentioned on the right to use it in any other way that may be more profitable
 than letting it to tenants on condition that they take all reasonable care that the said land be not
 unimproved even so improve for a part of Chicago the profits or otherwise to be my youngest sons and
 wife that is they shall have to receive said part of the profits & lower division when my son Eliza
 Richardson is of age to pay it as above division also of the said land & upper division when my son
 James Witherspoon is of age to pay it as above division. Moreover on condition that my two eldest
 sons above named receiving said part they shall have all the cleared land under good & sufficient
 farming when it comes to be helped by my youngest sons — If either of my children should die
 before he or she shall come to be of age I will that his or her inheritance shall be equally divided
 among all my living children — 7th. I will and bequeath that my two eldest sons Samuel
 Harvey & John Newton furnish the female parts of my family with a sufficiency of glass wool &
 cotton if it can be procured at a moderate price and a good room for them to manufacture &
 when which they remain together and that my two eldest sons receive from their Mother & sister
 while they may have living of their own or separate from the family a sufficiency of summer &
 winter clothing Harvey myself expounding the bad effects of having to clothe a family with
 these goods and that the real & personal property mentioned in this will be not wasted or diminished
 but on the contrary increased if this be the divine will, until each of my daughters has received her
 inheritance in full & that you wife & I desire that each of my heirs without any further delay upon the same
 every purchase of any new articles until they can make ready payment with the fruit of their own labour —
 8th. Lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint William Stibler of John Nelson & Eliza J. Withers my executors of this my
 last will & testament & do hereby declare that to be my last & only will & testament signed published & declared by the above
 named John & Doak to be his last will & testament in the presence of us who have been at our names as witnesses in the
 presence of the children of my young wife as shown in due order by the acts of the 3rd Jan 1840 Doak
