BURKHALTER

Henry T. Burkhalter d. in Franklinton, La., in Aug., 1884, in his 70th year. He was the son of Daniel Burkhalter. Henry md. Theresa Luter, sister to Joseph Luter, who md. Eliza Burkhalter. Henry and Theresa had three known children:

- 1) Mary Ann Burkhalter md. John C. Foil of Washington Parish, La.
- 2) Emily Burkhalter md. John R. Wood of Washington Parish, La.
- 3) Henry S. Burkhalter, a sheriff of Washington Parish when accidentally killed in the 1890's; md. 1) Sele Lucas, and 2) Maria Lucas (Sele's sister).

Elizabeth Burkhalter and Joseph Luter had 10 children as follows: William Daniel, John J., Mary Ann, Jesse Crawford, Sarah Caroline, Therese Elizabeth, James Monroe, Thomas Jefferson, Louisa Matilda, and Jacob Westley. Most of these are buried at China Grove.

On pages 153-154 of Conerly's volume, a "fandango" is mentioned. This entertainment was held in the home of Eliza Burkhalter and Joseph Luter. Eliza's younger sister Louisa was the "star" performer.

CARTER

Isaac Carter was born in Cumberland County, North Carolina, in 1764; married in Orangeburg District, South Carolina, in 1780; and died in Pike County, Mississippi, Mar. 24, 1834. He is buried on Rocky Creek near Chatawa, Mississippi.

On Feb. 5, 1777, he joined the Revolutionary Army in N.C. and was in the army until Jan., 1780. Then, presumably, he was in Orangeburgh Dist., S.C., until 7/1/1781 when he re-enlisted. After discharge on 7/1/1782 he was again a resident of Cumberland Co., N.C., and remained there until summer, 1785. From 1785 until 1810 he resided in Orangeburgh Dist., S.D. In the spring, 1810, he moved by covered wagon caravan to Pike Co., Miss., having come from the Wateree River, through Georgia, and settled on the east side of Rocky Creek, Pike Co., Miss.

Isaac Carter married Ann Elizabeth (Nancy) Young, supposedly "Dutch, short, dumpy, jolly, adept, etc." She spoke Dutch and was born in Orangeburgh Dist., S.C. She died after Isaac, having spent her last years with her son Israel. Their issue:

All these children were well educated Latin scholars, classical students. Harville in particular was musically talented.

Isaac Carter's war record: Volunteer, N.C. Regt., Col. Hogan, Capt. John Welch's Co., 2/5/1777--to winter after, then transferred to Cpt. Robt. Fenner's Co., Col. Sylvanus Harney's Regt. In Battles of Brandywine, Germantown, Monmouth, and discharged Lockhart's Folly, 30 miles south of Wilmington, N.C., about 1/1780. From 7/1/1781 to 7/1/1782 he served in Capt. Dennis Porterfield's Co. of N.C. Militia, a "balloted substitute." Wounded in arm at Eutaw Springs. Discharged at Bacon's Bridge, S.C.

Family data:

- 1) William Carter md. Hannah Cole at Liberty, Miss. He was 20 yrs old when he came to Miss. from S.C. with father. His war record: War of 1812: 1st Lieut. in Cpt. Henry Quin's Co., 13th Regt. (Nixon's) Miss. Served from 1/6/1815 to 2/5/1815. Enlisted at Magnolia, Miss. His brother Hardy Carter served as a private in the same company.

- 7) Burrell Carter md. Judith Taylor, widow of Robert White and the mother of Caroline Virginia White, called Callie. Burrell was b. 6/3/1796 and d. 8/28/1860, at Darlington, La. He served in the War of 1812. He resided at Darlington's Plantation, Chipola, La., and was buried on Darling's Cr. as was Judith and daughter Malitta Ann Quin. Judith was b. 11/3/1796 and d. 5/2/1883. Issue:
