Provided always that if three years of the said feoff shall at any time
be in arrear and unpaid or if the said Richard Harrison his Heirs & Assigns do
not within the space of three years next coming after the date of these presents
cultivate and improve three Acres part of every fifty of the Earth abovesayd
^(except as before in execente)
then the Rents hereby granted shall cease and be utterly determined and thereafter
it shall and may be lawful to and for us our Heirs and Successors to grant the same
Land and Premises with the Appurtenances unto some other person or persons
as we our Heirs and Successors shall think fit **In Witness** whereof we
have caused these our Letters Patent to be made **Witness** our huse and wellbeloved

or parcel of Land containing Three hundred and thirty five Acres lying and
being in the County of Prince George between Butterwood and White Oak Swamps

 shall come greeting. Know ye that for divers good Causes and
 Considerations but more especially for and in Consideration of the sum of

 to our Servicer General of our Personnes in this our Colony and Dominion
 of Virginia We have given granted and confirmed and by these presents
 for us our heires and Successors do give grant and confirm unto Richard
 Harrison one certain tract or parcel of Land containing four hundred
 acres lying and being in the County of Prince George between Stony and
 Sappona Creeks and on the lower side of the Roedy Branch adjoining
 the County line and bounded as followeth to wit The beginning
 in Joseph Eubanks line of his one hundred and fifty acres thence west
 thirty five degrees north twenty poles to his corner thence along another
 of his lines north eighteen degrees west fifty eight poles to the Roedy Branch
 thence up the same as it meanders to Joseph Eubanks lower corner on the
 same thence along his lower lines south forty degrees west fifty eight poles to
 his corner thence along another of his lines south thirty one degrees west
 one hundred and forty poles to a red Oak corner by a Branch of the Roedy Branch
 thence south thirty degrees east two hundred and fifty five poles to the boundary
 line thence along the same east thirty degrees north two hundred and six poles
 to a corner of John Williamson in the same thence north thirty degrees west
 one hundred and eighty poles to the beginning adjoining John Williamson
 line two hundred acres part thereof being formerly granted unto the said Richard
 Harrison by our Letter patent bearing date the tenth day of June one thousand
 Seven hundred and forty and two hundred acres the same never before granted
 With all trees underwood, swamps marshes low grounds, meadows
 pastures and the like share of all veins mines and Quarries as well
 situated as not discovered within the bounds aforesaid and being part of
 the said quantity of four hundred acres of land and the River Naylor and
