 these Presents shall come Greeting KNOW YE that for divers good  
 400 Acres causes and Considerations but more Especially for and in Consideration  
 of the sum of Forty Shillings of good and lawfull Money for our use  
 paid to our Receiver General of our Revenues in this our Colony  
 and Dominion of Virginia WE HAVE Given Granted and confirmed  
 and by these Presents for us our Heirs and Successors do  
 Give Grant and Confirm unto William Jones one certain Tract or  
 Parcel of Land containing Four hundred Acres lying and being in  
 the County of Goochland on both sides the North branch of the three  
 forks of slate River and Friesby's Creek and bounded as followeth  
 to wit BEGUNNEING at two Pine Loggins in John Jones's &  
 running thence now lines North sixty four Degrees West two hundred  
 and eighty Poles to Pointers South twenty five Degrees West two  
 hundred and sixty five Poles crossing Friesby's Creek to a white  
 Oak south fifty two Degrees East one hundred and seventy five  
 Poles bearing the North branch to Pointers North forty five Degrees  
 East twenty two Poles to Pointers John Jones's corner and thence  
 on John Jones the same course continued three hundred Poles  
 crossing the North branch to the Forest Station WITH ALL  
 Woods Underwoods Swamps Marshes Lawngounds Meadowes Feedings  
 and his due share of all Vines Mines and Quarries as well discovered  
 as not discovered within the bounds aforesaid and being part of the  
 said Quantity of four hundred Acres of Land and the Rivers Waters  
 and Marsh Courses therein contained together with the Privileges of  
 Hunting Hawking Fishing Bowling and all other Profits Commodities  
 and Hereditaments whatsoever to the same or any part thereof  
 belonging or in any wise appertaining TO HAVE HOLD  
 Possess and Enjoy the said Tract or Parcel of Land and all other the  
 before Granted Premises and every part thereof with their and every of  
 their Appurtenants unto the said William Jones and to his Heirs and  
 Assigns forever To the only use and behoof of him the said William  
 Jones his Heirs and Assigns forever TO BE HELD of us our  
 Heirs and Successors as of our Manor of East Greenwich in the County  
 of Kent in free and common socage and not in Capite or by Knights  
 service PLEDGING AND PAYING unto us our Heirs and  
 Successors for every fifty Acres of Land and so proportionably for a lesse  
 or greater Quantitie than fifty Acres the Fee Rent of one Shilling Yearly  
 to be paid upon the Feast of Saint Michael the Arch Angel And also  
 Cultivating and Improving three Acres part of every fifty of the Tract  
 abovementioned within three Years after the date of these Presents  
 PROVIDED always that if three Years of the said Fee Rent shall at  
 any time be in Arrear and unpaid or if the said William Jones his  
 Heirs or Assigns do not within the space of three Years next coming  
 after the date of these Presents Cultivate and Improve three Acres part

and the Uppermost of the South branches of the three forks of the River -  
River and bounded as followeth to wit BEGUNNEING at a red Oak  
in John Jones's line and running thence north west through twenty six  
Degrees West one hundred and eighty six Poles to a white Oak saylin  
South sixty four Degrees East two hundred and thirty Poles crossing the  
Middle branch to a Pine North thirty four Degrees East two hundred Poles  
crossing the South branch to a white oak saylin North eleven Degrees -  
East two hundred and sixty two Poles to Pointers in John Jones's line  
thence on the same South forty five Degrees West two hundred and -  
ninty eight Poles crossing the South branch to Pointers and North fifty  
Degrees West eighty six Poles crossing the Middle branch to the four -  
Station North all Woods Underwoods Swamps Marshes Landgrounds  
Meadows Feedings and his due Share of all Veins Mines and Quarries
