 friend John Fawcett of the County of Northampton my true & lawfull Attorney
 for me & in my name place & stead, to shew demand receive & recover
 of all persons that are or may be Debtors to me the said Pinxar in the County
 of Northampton in the County of Virginia & in case of nonpayment to distress
 seize imprison & out of prison to release acquitt & discharge all persons
 as he my said Attorney shall thinke convenient and full & further give my
 said Attorney power to defend all such depending against me the said Pinxar
 in any of his Maj^{ty} Courts of Justice in the said County & the City of his
 Indignment & whatsoever my said Attorney shall legally act or doe in p^{re}miss
 I do hereby ratify and confirm, as full forth as if I were or could be
 personally p^{re}sent my self with my hand & seale this 4th day of July 1671

I John Dolly son of the Parish of Hargrave and County of Northampton in Virginia being
 sick & weak of Body but of perfect memory & understanding (thanks be to my Heavenly Father)
 making all former wills by me made, do make this my last will and Testament
 in manner and form following: viz^t My Soul I give and bequeath to God who galler
 it, and my body to be buried according to the direction of my dear and loving wife
 Iken for my worldly goods &c. I give I bequeath unto the two daughters of my
 son Edward, the one named Margaret the other Jane, One yearling after with her
 increase for ever, if either of them dye before age or marriage and the survivor
 to enjoy. I then I give to the Three Children William Maj (named John Daggard)
 and Mary) one part of 3 year old now in my possession with her increase for ever
 jointly and equally and the survivor to enjoy if either dye before age or marriage,
 (only excepted) it is my will that the first male of the said Mary I give personally
 to Thomas Son of Obidime Johnson. I then I bequeath unto the two Children
 of Obidime Johnson named Thomas and Temperance one yearling after
 and one Cow and Calf with their increase for ever, and if either dye before
 age or marriage the survivor to enjoy. I then I give to my Son Peter one
 horse known by the name of Flaggot being an Iron Grey of colour which I had of
 my Uncle Geo. And more I bequeath to my son Peter the best of my cattle his
 and at his disposal after my decease. I then to my son John I give one
 pair of Shocks and also give to acquitt him from all Debts and demands due
 me upon my book of Accounts; I then to my dear and loving wife I
 give my house known by the name of Turbo for her sole use and all my other
 priety what are before expressed Legacies towards the making good my debts &
 Acquests to Andrew Andrew Quapan. I then the Horse named white Doe I give
 jointly to Geo. of the Plantation & to the King of Newwood & other orations, and also
 my will to be read full jointly to my dear wife & my son Peter

Part (6) Item my wearing cloth I leave to the disposing of my loving wife to be dish-
 = bled to my children as she shall see fit. Item I give unto my dear wife one
 boy servant named William Ridge at her disposing until he shall accomplish
 the Age of Twenty one Year of my said loving wife so long she shall live
 otherwise and after the death of my said wife I bequeath the said William to my Son
 Peter. Item I give unto William Ridge my servant one half year with his
 wardrobe for ever. Item I give to my dear wife & to my Son Peter jointly
 all my Land during the life of my said dear wife, and after the death of my
 said dear wife I give unto my Son Edward and to my Son John equally one hundred
 shires of Land but not less, lying and bounding on the Land of May John Tilney
 and two hundred & fifty acres of Land I bequeath to my Son Peter
 having the remainder of my Plantation and bounding on the Land of Mr. John
 Worslow to each one according to his share. Item to my dear wife I give my
 new built house, two Chambers & two under rooms for her proper
 use: and to my Son Peter I give the porch Chamber for his proper use
 and the old hall: and the rest of the house and Tobacco house, to be for their
 equal use: dividing with my Son Peter to be Assistant to my dear
 wife in leading and ordering the house: on their Plantation. Item the rest
 of my Estate I bequeath to my dear wife until
 my debts shall be paid and satisfied, and from thence the thirds of the
 remainder to be long unto my dear wife and the residue to be divided
 amongst my children equally. Item I constitute & make my dear wife
 Sole Executrix of this my will which I desire and request her to perform
 according to the intent and meaning hereof which I have testifies with
 my hand and Seal this twenty ninth day of April Anno Christi -
 1671.
