do by this present instrument authorise ordigne & appoint my trusty & well beloved  
friend John Tandy of the County of Northampton my true & lawfull attorney  
for me & in my name place & chalke, to do & to demand, entitle, lay & recover  
of all persons that are or may be Distress to me the said Peppas in the County  
of Northampton in the Colony of Virginia & in case of non payment to have  
imprisone & out of prison to release, acquit & discharge all persons  
as to my said Attorney shall think convenient and fit, & further give my  
said Attorney power to defend all suits depending against me the said Peppas  
in any of his Maj<sup>t</sup>s Courts of Justice in the said County to the best of his  
judgement & whatsoever my said Attorney shall legally and orderly do in my premises  
& do hereby ratifie and confirm, as full forth as if I were or could be  
personally present myself witness my hand & seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day of July 1671

I John Tandy son of the Parish of Hungar<sup>t</sup> and County of Northampton in Virginia: being  
sixt<sup>t</sup> year of Bodij<sup>t</sup>, but of perfect memory & understanding (having lost my braine)  
desirous all former parts by me made, do make this my last will and Testament  
in manner and forme following: w<sup>t</sup>z: My Soule I give and bequeath to God who gat  
it, and my body to be buried according to the direction of my deces and to my wife -  
Item for my worldly goodys &c I bequeath unto the two daughters of my  
son Edward, the one named Margaret the other Anne, One yearling Ox with his  
increas for their, of either of them dy before age or marriage and their heirs  
to enjoy: Item I give to the three children William Maj<sup>t</sup> (named John Margaret  
and Mary) one man of 3 years old now in my possession with his increase, for their  
jointly and equally and the survivor to enjoy if either dies before age or marriage,  
(only excepted) it is my will that the first foale of the said Mary I give presently  
to Thomas Son of Obidens Johnson. Item I bequeath unto the two children  
of Obidens Johnson named Thomas and Elizabeth one yearling Ox  
and one Cow and Calf with their increase for their, and if either die before  
age or marriage the survivor to enjoy. Item I give to my son Peter one  
horse known by the name of Higgett being an swa horsey of colour w<sup>t</sup> I had of  
my Hug<sup>t</sup> yro: and more I bequeath to my son Peter the Calfe now called his  
and at his desesne after my decease. Item to my son John I give one  
pair of Shears and a pair to a quitt him from all Distre and demands due  
me upon my body of Higgett; Item to my deare and weyng wife I  
give my horse known by the name of Turf for her sole use and al my other  
priest what are before excepted Liggatt towards the making good my distre  
Accompt w<sup>t</sup> Andrew Andrew Copshan. Item the Horse named which Dorff I give  
joyfully to the Plantation for fitting of Hawwood & other occasions, and also  
my Hatt to be well joyfully weare with my son Peter

Par(6) John my weareing Clotheys I leave to the disposure of my loving wife to be distributed  
= betwixt her children as she shall see fit. Item I give unto my dear wife our  
boy Servant named William Ridge at her disposure until he shall accomplish  
the age of twenty one year of my said loving wife so long shall hee live  
otherwise and after decess of my said wife I signe and seal William to my Sonne  
Peter. Item I give unto William Ridge my Servant one hundreth with his  
incomes for ever. Item I give to my dear wife to pay her Rector yearly  
all my Landes, during the life of my said dear wife, and after the decess of  
said poor wife I give unto my Son Edward and to my Son John equally one hundred  
Acre of Land but one, lying and boundinge on the Land of my Son John Tilney  
and two hundred & fifty acres of Land I signe and seal to my Son Peter  
bearing the remainder of my Plantation and boundinge on the land of my children  
orphan to each one according to his age. Item to my dear wife I give my  
new built house, first Chamber w<sup>th</sup> two under Roome for her propper  
use: and to my Son Peter I give the poore Chamber for his propper use  
and the old bed: and the rest of the house and to both houses to be for their  
equall behoufe: during which time my Son Peter to be chasshant his deare  
wife in hading and ordering his goods in this Plantation. Item the rest  
of my estate And my Tolls & Bills I signe and seal to my loving wife untill  
my debts shall be paid and satisfied, and from thence the thirds of the  
remainder to belong unto my deare wife and the other two to be divided  
amongst my children equally. Item I constabule of making my dear wife  
sole Executrix of this my will which I desire and request her to performe  
according to the intent and meaning hereof which I have left by and with  
my hand and Seal. This twenty ninth day of July anno Domini Christi -  
Signed Aug: 20. Compt' 1671.
