That Isaac Weddall at his first coming not taking our keeping said he
 never saw any goodly ship: so in the Country before and if he had not long to stay
 as soon of us, he would have himself before the water was it, but it passed till
 the day by all James Carter & little else spoke of it then was all ready to take
 the boat that belonged to the ship, so: concluding we took it away saying John
 Carter answered what need we do: that I can take the ship: saying but of little
 left for I have my wife & her things by: I said to him again that was pity, he never
 again pity applied a City: then says Isaac I can make better, one forepart at
 Greenwich would not know: & went into the woods of a Friday morning & having
 that night John Carter & he ravined the saying & away over the wood & about & I
 went to my country & Chalkins: so next day two agreed to go for Mary said
 that she had agreed to take of water out Lincolne that she had not taken & he
 had said that day to carry with us & sent this: I went to the Mill for water
 but how many I have seen: so in the night we fetched the boat over by a river

 And that time my Master called me to know whether I liked to go Monday of next
 at sea Robin desired me to say I knew nothing I did this Sunday following
 then Board & I standing this Robin looking out of the window saw I
 go to the stable with something under his foot & then Board swore I Ellop
 was a simple Devil to do as he said and I asked him why & he said he had borrowed
