I George Parker of Accomack County in the Colony of Virginia Gent. being Sick & weak but of perfect sense & memory do make & ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form following (Vizt)

I Give up my Soul to my Creator & that Gave it with full Sure & Certain hope of Redemption by y^e Blood & merits of my Blessed Saviour Jesus Christ. And my Body I Commit to y^e Dust from whence it came to be Buried att y^e discretion of my wife.

I Give & Bequeath unto my Son George Parker & his heirs for Ever all my Land & now lye upon & lyeing on the North side of Mansock when he shall arrive at all the Age of one & Twenty years, during which time I do will that my wife do enjoy & possess the same But in Case she should Marry before my said Son should arrive at y^e Age aforesaid, then my said Son George is to have possession of one half of y^e said Land as aforesaid half of y^e same shall be lyeing standing & being thereon; But I do further will y^e my said Son shall not att any time sell or Dispose of any of the Land aforesaid to any one whatsoever or to lease y^e same during part thereof for above one & Twenty years.

I Give unto my Son John Parker & his heirs for Ever my land lyeing on the South side of Mansock obliging him not to sell or Dispose of y^e same or Lease y^e same as aforesaid.

I Give & Bequeath unto my Son George all my land in England & his heirs for Ever hereby Reserving & reserving my land in London Hamlet to live & remain for my said Son my said Son in England & to reimburse the charges of such charges or to pay at they shall be at out of y^e said Estate when I should be my said Son George his Executors; And I do further Give unto my said Son George his Executors & shall be Resolved on y^e said Land my four Sons now living.

I do hereby Give & Bequeath unto my two youngest Sons by name Phillip & Charles Parker & their heirs for Ever all other Land whatsoever which and or shall hereafter be reputed or found to be mine.

my Will is that all y^e former Engagements of all such Cattle that at y^e first reputed & accounted to belong to my Children or any of them shall always for remaine to their use & enjoy.

I Give & Bequeath unto my Son George that Mary Ward called Mary which I formerly Gave him, as aforesaid to my Daughter Abigail the Grey Ward called the Coopers Ward, & her Cattle to my Son John with their Entails that shall hereafter belong unto them to Run upon this Plantation untill they my said Children shall come of Age except they shall otherwise think fitt; And I do further Bequeath unto my aforesaid Daughter Abigail att her day of Marriage my Dress Bed & furniture.

I Give unto my Brother John Parker my Best Suits of Apparel with my Best Hat & Best Saddle.

I Give & Bequeath unto my Thomas & my wife Bayard. I do will y^e rest of my Estate personally I do Give & Bequeath unto my wife Florence Parker & my six Children, That is to say one third thereof unto my said wife & y^e other two thirds to be Equally divided amongst my said Children their lawful parts or share to be divided them as they shall arrive att their full & respective Age.

Executors of this my last will & Testament. Desiring that no
Appoyment or Indenture be taken of my Estate but what shall
be done by them my above named overseers; For witnesses whereof
