being sick and weak in body, yet thanks be to God in
your full sound and memory do make and ordain this
my last will and Testament in manner and form
as followeth

Imp^E. I bequeath my soul to almighty God who gave it &
my body to the Earth to be decently buried

Item — I give and bequeath unto my Eldest Son George
Smith two hundred acres of land lying on the south
side of the dividant, whereon I am now situated
given to him and his heirs for ever, but if it should
please God that the said George Smith should dy wthout
issue then the sd land to be returned to his Brothers to
them and their heirs for ever and that the sd George
Smith do not molest or hinder my wife Joynt
from any priviledges of her own orchard or
plantation during the time of
her widowhood but if the marry againe the sd
George Smith to enjoy the plantation to himselfe as aforesaid
and the during her life to live upon some other part of
the dividant where she will

Item — I give and bequeath to my Son James Smith one hundred
and fifty acres of land lying upon the above mentioned
land given to George Smith given to him and his heirs for
ever, Item: I give and bequeath to my Son John Smith one
hundred and fifty acres of land lying upon the above
mentioned land given to James Smith given to him the sd
Smith should dy without issue then his part to be returned to my
youngest son Thomas Smith to him and his heirs for ever
I also give unto my son George Smith my both suits of clothes
and one featherbed and bolster, I also give unto my Daughter
Ann Hamman four hundred pounds of tobacco to buy her
clothes and no more I give to my son in law Edward Haman
my both wearing hatt. I give and bequeath unto my five
youngest children two shares them and their mthparts for
over to run in a joynt stock wth seven years be expired
only the first share bet that either of them shall bring to
be given amongst Edward Hamans children all the wth of
I bequeath unto my well beloved wife Joynt Smith and my
five youngest children James and John and Thomas Smith

Director and Joynt Smith to be equally divided amongst
 them share and sharelike only one Horse I give to my
 wifes proper use I also give unto my son in law Thomas
 Savage six hundred lbs of tobacco to be paid the next
 ensuing crop I also give unto John Thompson my Gun
 Powder: and to his wife Rebecca I give one Hundred lbs of
 tobacco to buy her a hood and a pair of gloves I do also
 ordaine and appoint John Thompson George Smith and
 Thomas Savage as overseers over my children above named
 and that what is here given to them unto which I do set my
 hand and seal this 27th of October 1677 my will and desire
 is that my male children may be for them selves at the age of
 eighteen yeares and the females at fifteen

 sound & memory blessed be God for it did breame this my
 last will & Testament in manner & form following
 First - I bequeath my soule into the hands of God that gave it in
 certaint hope of a joyfull Resurrection at the last day in
 through the merits of Jesus Christ my Redeemer & my body
 to be buried at the discretion of my heire after named

Secondly - I give unto my Daughter Amey the Plantation at Bungoye
 on the Sea side in Accomack County containing six
 hundred & fifty acres to her & her heirs for ever
 provided my said Daughter will give & confirm unto my
 Daughter Elizabeth & her heirs for ever one hundred
 acres of land given her by her Grandfather Hooker but if
 she shall Refuse to doo that then my Daughter Elizabeth
 to have the said six hundred & fifty acres at Bungoye
 aforesaid & my Daughter Amey to have the Plantation where
 on I now live to her & her heirs for ever
 but if she confirm ye hundred acres aforesaid to my Daughter
 Elizabeth then my will is that my Daughter Elizabeth have the
 Plantation & now live on to her and her heirs for ever
