sick & weak in body but of sound & perfect memory thanks
be to God do make & ordain this my last will & Testament
this 16th day of March 1676 and in the 29th year of the reign
of our Sovereign Charles the 2^d of England Scotland France
and Ireland King do order of y^e faith &c in manner &
form following —

I give & bequeath my soule into y^e hands of all-mighty God my
Creator, of Jesus x^t my Redeemer, & of the Holy Ghost my
Sanctifier & preserve my body decently to be buried according
to the discretion of my deare & well beloved wife hoping for a
blessed and joyfull resurrection at the last day —
And as for my worldly estate which it hath pleased God to
put into my hands I do order & dispose of the same as followeth

10. I give & bequeath unto my well beloved wife: Mirroll Huitt my
Wife at Chowatock whereon I now live during her naturall
life & after her decease to my daughter Mary Huitt & her heirs
for ever in said the dyed before marriage & without heirs
whom my will is that it here remaine unto my son in law Richard
Joanes Junio^r to him & his heirs for ever —

I give & bequeath unto: Rowland Savage three hundred acres
of land situate & lying at Bungolague the same whereon
he now lives to him & his heirs for ever acknowledging
that it was his own purchase although included in my bill
of sale —

I give & bequeath unto my son in law Richard Jones Junio^r
three hundred acres of land situate and lying at Bungolague
next adjoining unto Rowland Savage the same whereupon he
hath begun to reside to him & his heirs for ever & I do
acknowledge that it was his own purchase although included
in my deed of sale —

I give & bequeath unto my daughter Mary Huitt two
hundred acres of land lying & being at Bungolague &
adjoining unto the land of Rowland Savage & Richard Jones
before mentioned to her and her heirs for ever & in said
the dyed unmarried, & without child or children whom my will is
that the said two hundred two hundred acres of land do
remaine unto Francis Savage the son of Rowland Savage to him
and his heirs for ever.

I give unto Mary Savage the daughter of Rowland Savage
one two year old heifer with all her futur increase to be delivered
her presently after my death

30th I give unto Richard Joans some my muskett. the stock
and iron both

I give unto Richard Joans a Gun called low Golden a
Case of Pistols a Barbed & Sullard

my will is that all the rest of my Estate both real & -
Personal (after my debts & Legacies be payed) be Equally
Divided betwixt my dearly beloved wife Missoll Hunt &
said Daughter Mary Hewitt to be divided betwixt them when my
said Daughter Mary is at the age of sixteen years or is
married which shall first happen: And I make my trusty
and well beloved wife Executrix of this my last will &
Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and Seal the day and year above written
