 them share and sharelike only one Horse I give to my
 wifes proper use I also give unto my son in law Thomas
 Savage six hundred lbs of Tobacco to be paid the next
 ensuing Crop I also give unto John Thompson my Gun
 Coat: and to his wife Rebecca I give one Hundred lbs of
 Tobacco to buy her a hood and a pair of gloves I do also
 ordaine and appoint John Thompson George Smith and
 Thomas Savage as overseers over my Children above named
 and that wht is here given to them unto which I do set my
 hand and seal this 27th of October 1677 my will and desire
 is that my male Children may be for them selves at the age of
 Eighteen years and the females at fifteen

I Robert Mason being sick & weak in body but of perfect
 mind & memory Blessed be God for it did breame this my
 last will & Testament in manner & form following
 First - I bequeath my soule into the hands of God that gave it in
 certaint hope of a joyfull Resurrection at the last day in
 through of merits of Jesus Christ my Redeemer & my body
 to be buried at the discretion of my hereafter named exors

Secondly - I give unto my Daughter Amey the Plantation at Bungoye
 on the Sea side in Accomack County containing six
 hundred & fifty acres to her & her heirs for ever
 provided my said Daughter will give & confirm unto my
 Daughter Elizabeth & her heirs for ever one hundred
 acres of land given her by her Grandfather Hooker but if
 she shall Refuse to doo that then my Daughter Elizabeth
 to have the said six hundred & fifty acres at Bungoye
 aforesaid & my Daughter Amey to have y^e Plantation where
 on I now live to her & her heirs for ever
 but if she confirm y^e hundred acres aforesaid to my Daughter
 Elizabeth then my will is that my Daughter Elizabeth have the
 Plantation & now live on to her and her heirs for ever

further I give unto my daughter Elizabeth my gray mare
 saddled & bridled with all her furniture make & harness for ever
 except ye first mare (old) the bringeth, as also two heifers
 I give to my daughter Elizabeth two year old apiece
 to be delivered to her viz next spring with all their
 furniture make & harness for ever, moreover I give
 to my daughter Elizabeth one pair of shoes & one
 pair of blankets & a rug all now to be delivered her
 at the age of fourteen year at what time my will is lay
 so at age & then & not till then to be pasted of hand & land

I give & bequeath unto my daughter Amey my Bay -
 saddle faced mare with all her furniture make & harness
 except her first mare (old) to her & her heirs forever
 as also two heifers of two year old apiece to be delivered
 for her viz next spring as also one saddle cloth & six napkins
 one new good tickin & a pair of blankets to be delivered
 her at the age of fourteen year at what time my will is
 so at age

I give & bequeath unto my godson Robert Parker y. first
 mare (old) if either of my daughters marcs bring to be
 delivered at six months old

I give & bequeath unto my goddaughter Mary Wiggin the
 second mare (old) my daughter's marcs shall bring being one
 of the two excepted, as aforesaid to be delivered at six -
 months old

Also I give & bequeath unto Thomas white a young horse two
 year old next spring being up (old) of my daughter Amey's mare
 I give him also my good suit of clothes & good hat & my little
 gun

I also give & bequeath unto my loving wife all & all manner
 of my estate whatsoever except such legacies as by this my will
 of this my last will & testament ordaining her sole executrix
 which to be assistant to her wth advice & to my land
 I have set to my hand & seals this 12th day of October 1677
