The last will and testament of Thomas Blacklock being sick in body &  
 in perfect memory and mind —

First — I bequeath my soul to God who gave it and my body to the Earth  
 from whence it came desiring a decent funeral & appointing  
 my wife Christian Blacklock to be my full & whole Executrix to  
 my affairs of my Son Thomas Blacklock to whom I do give my  
 Plantacion where I now live to him and his heirs for ever and for  
 what worldly Estate I have to be Equally divided between my said  
 wife and three children, and if either of my said children shall  
 die in their Minority or without lawfully heirs then their  
 part of the Estate to be Equally divided between the other  
 two of my children & at some convenient time within one  
 year my desire is that my Esq Jno West & Ap<sup>r</sup> Richard Hill  
 and Jno Drumond would divide my estate as above ordered  
 to my wife & children all which I do confirm by my  
 hand and seal this twenty ninth day of November  
 1838

To all Christian People to whom this present writing shall come I  
Halo & In<sup>r</sup> West of Accomack County Sons Greeting in our Lord  
God everlasting Know ye that I for a good & Lawfull confederacion  
in Hand stretched doe hereby acknowledge alien grant Bargain & Sale  
in foffe & litle Confirme assigne and set over unto In<sup>r</sup> New  
of the County aforesaid and his heires for ever three hundred acres  
of Land lying and being the aforesaid County on the South Side &  
four Thousand five hundred acres patented by m<sup>r</sup> Charles Scarburgh  
m<sup>r</sup> Devonax Brown and m<sup>r</sup> In<sup>r</sup> West aforesaid bearing date  
March 25<sup>th</sup> 1671 The sd Three hundred acres of Land bounded on  
the North Side by the Sall marshes of Hunting Creek ~~on the west~~  
Northeast by Holman Branch of the fords back Creek and  
and South west by the Lands of the Rile and John Lewis and running  
Easterly toward the Land of Peter Carvel which three hundred acres  
of Land w<sup>th</sup> all the woodes, waters Rivers troffits Conditio<sup>n</sup> and  
appertaining whatsover thereto belonging or appertaining together  
with all my right Ditt in largest Caint or Demands whatsover to  
have & to hold the said Land w<sup>th</sup> the appertaining to him AD 1677  
In witness my hirys & assignes for ever in as full and ample  
manner to all intents and purpyses as by vertue of any right  
Ditt or claim whatsoever I may might or could have had to occupy  
or posse the same and I the aforesd West & my heirest hat to Land  
and premis w<sup>th</sup> the appertaining unto the same & his heirest  
against me & my heirest or the caint or Caint of any person or  
persons whatsoever shall & will warrant & for ever defend by law  
present in witness whereof I have set to sett my hand and  
set my Seal this 14<sup>th</sup> of September 1677
