The last will and Testament of Thomas Blacklock being sick in body &
in perfect memory and sense

First — I bequeath my soul to God who gave it and my body to the Earth
from whence I came desiring a decent funeral & appointing
my wife Christian Blacklock to be my full & whole Ex^{ec}utrix
my ad^{or} of my son Thomas Blacklock to whom I doe give my
Plantation where I now live to him and his heirs for ever and for
what worldly Estate I have to be Equally divided betwixt my said
wife and three children, and if either of my said children should
die in their Minority or without lawfully heirs then their
part of the Estate to be Equally divided betwixt the other
two of my children & at any convenient time within one
year my Intent is that ma^r In^o Wool & ap^r Richard Hill
and J^r Drummond would divide my Estate as above ordered
to my Wife & children all which I doe confirm with my
hand and seals this Twentieth Ninth day of November
1676
