Witnesses to the within Last Will and Testament
of Peter Walker late deceased made Oath
in Open Court of Accomack County that they
saw the same sealed, Delivered and Subscribed
as the Act and Deed of the Testator and declared
the same to be his Last Will and Testament

Septemb^r the 15th 1696 Richard Blowers the other
Witness to the same Last Will and Testament of the
above named Peter Walker made Oath in Open
Court of Accomack County that he saw the same
also sealed and Delivered and published as the
Act and Deed of the Testator, and declared the
same to be his Last Will and Testament.

In the Name of God Amen I Alexander Johnson
of the County of Accomack and Colony of Virginia am
sick of Body but of perfect Memory, persuaded to by
Almighty God for W^t I do make this my Last Will and Testament
Disavowing all other Will and Wills that hath been by me
formerly made First I bequeath my Soule to God that
gave it me and my Body to Earth from whence I came
I do desire that all my worldly Debts may be paid, and to my
Buriall as my Executors think Convenient.

I give and bequeath to my two Daughters Elizabeth and
Sarah Johnson thirteen head of Cattle to be Equally
Divided between them when they shall come to the age
of sixteen years, and to be paid in the like kind as they
are when Received.

I give to my Daughter Sarah all my Hogs and do
Engage her Guardians to buy her 20 hundred acres of
Land Against she shall come to the age of sixteen
years and if the Hogs should not amount to 4
(or price of the Land then it is to be made up with

rest of my plate
I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Johnson and Sarah Johnson
these Maids with all their future Increase, only my Brother
Alexander Marsy is to have the Use of the Old Maids.
I give to my two Daughters Elizabeth Johnson and Sarah Johnson
the same to be Equally Divided between them when they
shall be of the age of sixteen years.

I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Johnson One pewter Dish and
Two Earthen Dishes and One plate, and One Earthen Jugge,
One Iron Pott, One Iron Pott, a Couple these Gallons and One
Pair of Gold and Silver two Blankets and paired Firetongs
and One flesh fork, One Pepp, One Linen Wheel, and One pair
of Iron Sticks.

I give to my Daughter Sarah One Iron Pott One Earthen Dish
One white Jugge, One plate, One Gridiron One Dish of Smoothing
Iron One Earthen Pander pott, and One Looking Glass and brush
One Pepp One Wooden Wheel, One pair of Wood Sticks, One peminier
One Leather Bed too Blankets and bolles, and pillow a flying pan

I give to my Brother in Law John Bowon my Smalest Gun, and
to my Nephew George Hall my Musket.

I give to my Brother Barnitt Ramsy all my Right and Title
of that Sixth of Land called Second parcels for ever I haveing
Received full Satisfaction for the same.

I give to my Brother Alexander Marsy, all my Carpenters and
Lathes tools, and all my wearing Coats, and good appoint me
two Servants towards the bringing up of my Children, and I do
appoint him and my Nephew to be my Executors, but if they
should dye then they shall be brought up and tutored by my
Brother Barnitt Ramsy and my Brother John Marsy, I give
my Servant Boy, and my Eldest Daughter to my Father in Law
and if my Father should dye then it is to return to the others
and I leave my Plantation that I now live on to my Daughter
Elizabeth Johnson, and my Brother Alexander Marsy to have
the management of it till my Daughter Elizabeth shall come
to the age of sixteen years

Alexander Johnson presented to the Court
September the 15th 1636. and Joseph Stockley
and John Patton two of the Witnesses to the
said Will made oath in open Court of

his Last Will and Testament.

 Virginia greeting. Know ye that the said Daniel Darby
 for divers good Causes and Considerations most
 moving, but especially for and in Consideration of
 and affection I bare to my well beloved Son William
 Darby, I have given, granted and confirmed, like as
 these presents I do give, grant, and confirm to my
 Son William Darby, the plantation he now liveth on
 containing fifty two Acres of Land to say his and
 his heirs for ever - So that neither I the said Daniel
 Darby, nor any Claiming from by or under me, shall
 at any time or times hereafter, after, Challenge
 Revert or demand any Right, Title or Estate to the
 aforesaid Land In Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and Seal the 12th day of September
 Anno Dom 1696.
