of Charles Pinwell being in memory & Remembrance his very neare
son make to ordain this my last will & Testament containing
as follows as followeth First I Begynne my selfe into the hand
of almighty God my maker hoping through the grace &
fession of my Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ to loose the pains
and forsworne of all my Sins and as for my body to be
buried at the Doorthon of my Executour hereafter named
first I give and bequeath my Black cattle being one hundred and fifty -
hers to my mother and my Sister for their Lifetimes and
after her deces to Pinwell Richardson and his heire for ever

3^{ly} I give my mother one bed and what Loups hold I have
4^{ly} ther paying all my just debts
I give my Sister one Cow & one Pferd of deppit
5^{ly} to my Richardson Plantation
I give John Bullington Jnr three Sons and pges
6^{ly} I give Sarah Richardson one Aroo.
7^{ly} I give Wm Richardson one Aroo.
8^{ly} I give Charles Richardson one Aroo.
9^{ly} I give one gun to John Richardson Jr.
10^{ly} I give my Saddle & Bridle to Thomas Richardson
11^{ly} I give my hars to Jas Richardson

and to his heirs or Agnes for ever in as full and ample
estate or under my shall or will at any time hereafter
give Chaling or Demand any right properties or interest to
the two hundred acres and Conveniences set off and known as
above by these presents

Know all men by these presents that I John Michael late of the
County of Accomack late of Northampton in Virginia being possessed of a
certain plantation in Accomack containing two hundred acres of land replete
with the last rents and improvements of my father and for divers good and
sufficient causes my threats moving but most especially whereas by & death of
my brother John Michael there was an estate fell to me and my
brother Simon Michael and to us to Simon being willing to divide
yel his right properties and interest in and to yel's late to me & to John
Michael and in Consideration of his so doing I give John Michael
my brother Allien Agnes Confinre Dolver and set over to yel to Simon
Michael and to his heirs or Agnes for ever all my right title and
interest to yel's plantation and two hundred acre with all buildings
growing orchard and all other privedges or Conveniences belonging to
yel's Land and plantation to him & to Simon and to his
heirs and Agnes for ever in full and ample manner to all intent
and purposes as yel same was given to me to see that neither I the
John Michael nor any other person by from or under me shall
or will at any time here after to give Chaling or Demand any
right properties or interest to yel's Land and plantation set off
and from all right interest or properties thereto shall and will be
for ever excluded and distanced by these presents
