I give unto my son George my Gun
I give unto my son William a gray horse which I now have
I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth one feather bed and bolster and
eyron post

I give to my son Pharis one feather bed and bolster
And the remainder of Estate I leave to my loving wife Ann
and also I appoint her to be Executrix to this my last will and
Testament I doe hereby make void all other wills or Testaments
by me formerly made I witness hereof I set my hand Seal
this day and yeare above written

Sense and Memory doe hereby make this my last will and Testament in
Manner and forme following viz^t

The primis I give and bequeath my Soule into the hands of almighty
God who gave it me and my body to y^e Earth to such Christian
like buriall as shall be thought fitting by my Loving wife
and for the woory Estate which God of his mercy hath given me
I give In manner and forme following viz

I give and bequeath unto my son John Darby one hundred
acres of Land formerly bought by my father (Norman Darby)
which Land I give to my son John and his heirs for ever
I give and bequeath unto my son Smith Darby and the y^e of his
wife now dead with all it a son his Name to be 1000 and
to which two I have my son Smith and my son Norman one
hundred twenty and five acres of Land beuth of Water
Littleton which Land I give Equally to my two sons

and Dormund and their heirs for ever but if my wife bring a daughter then the said hundred and twenty five acres of Land to be wholly my son Smiths and his heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my Loving wife Ann one feather bed and furniture one mare and six saddle two cows and the 3 sheep

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Dorritty one feather bed and bouldster a dugg and pair of Blankets one English Box one large pewter dish

Item I give unto my son George my pistol Carbine and sword my conveying knife and my Coopers tools

Item I give and bequeath unto my son one young cow one small plot and all my turners tools

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John my gun and one sword one Pawling Keffler and my Carpenters tools

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Smith one small Chest one pewter dish one porringer one plate of pewter

Item I give and bequeath unto the Child my wife now goes with all whether son or daughter one feather bed and bouldster one Rug and a pair of Blankets

Item I sett all my sons at age at Eighteen if their mother marry before they com to that age But if their mother continue a widow then to stay with her till one and twenty

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Churchill my Dragnet Coat and Tamash vest and the rest of my clothes amongst the rest of my sons

Item I give and bequeath unto my Loving wife all the remaining part of my hole Estate after my debts are paid furthermore I make and appoint my Loving wife Ann the Sole Executrix of this my Last will and Testament Revoking all other will or wills made by me at any time or times whatsoever as witness my hand and Seal this fourteenth day of December and in y^e year of our Lord 1700

 3rd day and next day in the evening and presents of the 8 persons
 did publish and declare in plaine and Express words now
 following to be his last will &c he the 3rd Wm Milby 1st he
 had two Brothers John Milby and Joseph Milby and he give
 all that he had to them to be Equally divided between them
 and to this truth we have hereunto set our hands and Seales

 Sparrow by And his now wife and in case of his death with
 out issue lawfully begotten of his body then to goe to his next
 heire at common Law alwayes provide that my beloved Mother
 and his grand mother Mrs Mathilda West shall have the hole
 use and benefit of the sd Land till y^e sd John shall attaine to
 the age of Eighteen yeares and then he to be possessed thereof
