I give and bequeath unto my Son William and George three hundred
acres of land lying upon y^e Head of Hunting Creek which I lately bought
of John Taylor in the County of Accomack to be equally divided
between them two

I give unto my Son George my Gun

I give unto my Son William a gray Horse which I now have

I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth one feather bed and bolster and
cotton pott

I give to my Son Charles one feather bed and bolster

the remainder of Estate I leave to my loving wife Ann
and also I appoint her to be Executrix to this my last will and
testament & do hereby make void all other wills & testaments
by me formerly made I witness hereof & set my hand seal
this Day and year above written

and Memory do hereby make this my last will and Testament in
Manner and forme following viz^e

The first I give and bequeath my Soule into the hands of almighty
God who gave it me and my body to y^e Earth to be decently buried
like burials as shall be thought fit by my loving wife
and for the worldly Estate which God of his mercy hath given me
I give in manner and forme following viz^e

I give and bequeath unto my son John Darby one hundred
acres of land formerly bought by my father Donald Darby
which I now give to my son John and his heirs for ever

I give and bequeath unto my son Smith Darby and his
wife now deceased with all it a son his Name to be Darby and
to which two the my son Smith and my son Norman one
hundred twenty and five acres of Land both at Hetham
Littleton which Land I give Equally to my two sons

and Dornund and their heires for ever but if my wife bring a daughter then the ~~land~~ hundred and twenty five acres of Land to be wholly my son Smith and his heires for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Ann one feather bed and furniture one mire and five candle two Pewes and the Creep

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Dorothy one feather bed and boulster a Jugg and pann of Blanck oates one English Box one Large pewter dish

Item I give unto my son George my pistol carbine and sword my Corveying knife and my Coopers tools

Item I give and bequeath unto my son one young Cow one small Pott and all my Turners tools

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John my gun and one sword one Earling Pepper and my Carpenters tools

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Smith one small Chest one pewter dish one porringer one plate of pewter

Item I give and bequeath unto the child my wife now goes with all whether son or daughter one feather bed and boulster one Jug and a jar of Blanck oates I sett all my Sons at age at Eighteen if their mother marry before they come to that age but if their mother continue a widdow then to stay with her twill one and twenty

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Flurhill my Dragnet Cat and Damask vest and the rest of my clothes amongst the rest of my Sons

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife all remaining part of my hole Estate after my debts are paid furthermore I make and assygn my loving wife Ann the sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament revoking all other wills or wills made by me at any time orter whatsoever as witness my hand and Seal this fourtene Day of December and in ye year of our Lord 1700

her wife Dorothy of this County sick and weak in body but
of sound mind and understanding who then and there on y^e
day and next day in the presence and presents of the said person
did publish and declare in plain and express words now
following to be his last will if he the sd Wm Milby Esq^r he
had two brothers John Milby and Joseph Milby and did give
all that he had to them to be Equally divided between them
and to this truth we have hereunto set our hands and sealed
