 Earth and bequeath unto my Sonne Elias Blake all that  
 Heft of Land with plantation now lies on quantity  
 Acre Leareys 50 acres of land more or less & I  
 purchased of Samuell Taylor which I give and bequeath  
 my Sonn Elias Blake also to him and his heirs for ever but  
 if my Son Elias Blake should dy without issue then both  
 my rights of Land before mentioned to fall to my son  
 William Blake and if in case my son William Blake should  
 dy without issue then my tract of Land to fall to my son  
 Charles Blake & his wife Bridget Blake and  
 to her and her heirs for ever  
 Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Bridget  
 Blake one feather bed and bolster and furniture belonging  
 to her and her heirs for ever  
 Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Bridget Blake  
 and to my four children all my personal estates to be  
 divided among them and their heirs for ever  
 further more than 50 acres of land that Samuell Taylor swept with  
 Elias Blake that is to say Samuell Taylor should be disturbed or  
 molested or the said land should be taken from him or his heirs  
 that he is paid of Samuell Taylor as he should have his land again of him  
 swept or changed for it with out trouble and annoy  
 In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this
