I Frances Foster of the County of Accomack  
finding my selfe sick and in a very weake condition  
out of perfect sense and memory and know  
that it is appointed for all flesh body and  
willing to settle that little worldly estate  
that y<sup>r</sup> Lord has indid me with as followeth  
first I bequeath my soule to Almighty God  
who gave it hoping for salvation and my body  
to the mother earth from whence it came  
Item I give and bequeath unto Marrett  
Foster one Iron Pot and a silver Seal  
Item I give and bequeath unto Richard Foster  
one Iron pot Samuell Foster to have his  
choice of the potts for his daughter Margaret  
Foster

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Thomas  
Foster my Bible and to his Daughter and to  
his Daughter Mary a sett of Silver tooth pickers

Item I give unto Susanna Sprune one Shilling  
and to her husband William Sprune 10<sup>l</sup>

Item I give and bequeath unto Francis Foster  
one feather bed that he y<sup>r</sup> sonn hally lies  
upon and the furniture belonging to it

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter  
Anne Foster the feather bed that y<sup>r</sup> sonn hally  
lye vpon my selfe with all the furniture  
that belong to it

Anne Foster my table and my Chest and a
