after my Just Debts and Dues are paid & given to my
 Exequat and disposed of in manner and forme following:-
 I give I leave my well beloved friends William Darnish
 Executor of this my Last will & Testament, - I give I give
 unto William Darnish my Executor one Chest and what
 is in it: - I give I give unto Anne Darnish if wife of
 I give I give unto Comfort Darnish my feather bed & all
 that belongs to it: - I give I give all my Cooper tools unto
 William Darnish for this end that he equally divide
 them among his Sons: -
 And I give I leave William Darnish after my Decease
 sole & sole Executor of this my Last will and Testament:
 and further it is will that Nicholas Molychops be
 Lefty Paid for my trouble of being at his house: - And
 nothing and dispensing all other Wills and Testament
 and only I doe acknowledge this to be my Last Will
 and Testament as now given under my hand and Seal
 this twenty seventh Day of February Anno Domini 1704

 the sum of three thousand five hundred pounds of Tobacco in full
 time in hand paid by Thomas Budd of said County before the
 signing & delivering thereof the Receipt whereof I do acknowledge
 and know do fully exonerate at quit & discharge the
 said Thomas Budd his heirs Executors & Assignators of every of them
 for ever by these presents Have aliened bargained sold &
 confirmed and by these presents do aline, bargain sold &
 confirm fully & absolutely unto said Thomas Budd his
 heirs Executors & Assignators & assigns for ever all that tract
 of Land containing one hundred acres situated lying & being
 in Accomack County neare Appawaman and bounded as followeth
 Beginning at a Corner marked great white Oak, and a Line now
 in possession of Doorea Godwin and from thence by a right line
 of marked trees South westerly eighty eight degrees, one hundred
 eighty five poles to a Cedar Oak; Then by marked trees North
 ninety three poles to a Cedar Oak; & the marked trees of Joseph
 Stock; then along these marked trees, West one hundred thirty
 two poles to a Corner Gum Standing by Machonomy Branch; & a
 Line and marked trees of said Godwin, and then by whod trees South
 west & by South ninety six poles to a first beginning, with all
 & singulars of Houfes, Buildings, Orchard Gardens ffenues, and all
