In y^e name of God I make my Will

I Henry Gibbins Senior finding my self very weak and
in a low condition and not knowing how soon it may
please God to call me out of this world out of a perfect
sense and memory and am willing to settle what worldly
estate I have and has induced me withall upon my wife
and Children as followeth
first I bequeath my soule unto the almighty God hoping
for salvation and my body to y^e mother Earth from whence it
came

secondly I bequeath unto my son John Gibbins my broad ax
and hand saw

thirdly I bequeath unto my son Henry Gibbins the bed
that now I lie on after my loving wife deces onon y^e
day of Marriage which may happen first

fourthly I bequeath unto my son Thomas Gibbins my
Gun

fifthly I bequeath unto my son Thomas and David my
sett of wedges in good order the longest lived to take y^e sett

sixthly I bequeath unto my loving wife all the remainder
part of my estate my Just debts to be paid out of it
and the remainder part after my debts are paid to be
equally divided between my loving wife and four Children
Thomas Elliner Sarah David G. Gibbins

and to be no waies diminished during the time of her
widowhood and if my loving wife should marry it is
my desire that my two ^{sons} Thomas and David should be at
age to be free from there mother or any brother in Law
at eighteen and if not married to stay with her till y^e
age of one and twenty and also my two Daughters Elliner
and Sarah if my wife marries to be at age at fourteen
if not to stay with her till fifteen

lastly it is my desire that my loving wife Frances Gibbins
should by my whole Executrix of my estate in doing as
my will requires and this I acknowledge as my real act and
deed and my last will and Testament as witness my hand
this 17th day of December 1707 the words John: her
wife Interline before signed

The within last will of Henry gibbins was proved in open C^ol of accom^{ts}
County by y^e oaths of Thomas Jenkinson and William Howard two of
the justices to y^e same and by y^e C^ol ordered to be record october y^e

I Charles Campbellson of Accomack County Mariner being very weak of body
want of good and perfect Memory but because death doth threaten and stare me in
face I make this my last will and Testament

I hereby make and constitute my true and well beloved wife my sole Executrix to dis-
pose of my Estate according to the full literall sense of this my will -
I hereby give and bequeath all my land and houses to my son Charles to him and his heirs
lawfully begotten of his Body lawfully to descend from him to him through out his own
nation

I have given unto my son aforesaid one young negro woman to be bought out of trial money
due to me from Tho: Harding to be bought by my Executrix before three years & expi-
red which negro woman with all her increase give unto my son as aforesaid to him &
his heirs & assigns to be used from time to time to have full & generous as six and then the people
or to dispose of if overplus at pleasure

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Charles my best feather Bede and bolster
two pillows one paire of Blanketts foure paire of new sheets two paire of
pillow beases the best quilt one paire of Curtaines and vallets one other Bed
and furniture but that which my wife please

I then I give my son Charles these from pots one bought of Goodman and y^e other of
Gerrill and y^e other y^e smallest pott in y^e house the small brass little one with mottles
shilldeth three paire of potshooke the largest fireshovel and tongs one brass ringjar
one frying pan one brass mortar and pestel one brass Ladle two new pewter —
bassins one tankard ditto one flagon ditto one large pewter platter and nine small
ones one dozen of pewter plates Marked M F one pewter Chamber pott new m. largest
Table fower Chairs my two largest Chests one box with drawers one pair of stick
all my books one halfe of my bottles

My will is that my fatill and sheep runn in a foynt till my wife Marianne is 45
my son to be maintained in Lering out of the stock Item I give and bequeath all the
rest of my personall Estate heere together with all the munge I have in the hands
of me Thos. Ellis's Mortgage in London to my well beloved wife —

If then it my wife remaine a widow tell my son alive at full age and so tell he
healt then my will is that my wife keep all my Estate in her hands tell her death
except my son marry when he comes to age which if he doth & doe give him my son
full power to take into his possession the increase of the fores^d negroe woman and
such other necessaries as my wife shall think fitt but not to remove them out my
plantation but to build upon or manure any part of my land but if my wife Interv
are before

carry before my son attaine to y^e age of twenty one then my will is that my son
 reman and take into his hands possession all his Estate which is given and bequeathed
 to him by this my will aforesaid when he shall attaine to the age of twenty one
 then if my wife should dye before my son attain to y^e age of twenty one whether she
 die in marriage or a widow my will is that my friends Rich^d Gibson take my son into
 his possession and have his honest labor and Industrie till he attaine to y^e age of twenty
 one for his accomodations and such learning as my friend shall think fitt for
 him

Item if my wife should die as aforesd and my R^d not at age 21, it is her
my friend Rich^d Wilson take all my sons Estate of what kind soever in by his
possession and deliver it to him my son when he shall arrive to the age of twenty
one and not before

I give unto my son two gold Rings one of them Large with the noble viz-
age in one by fiske a lone by the other posey my son takest I give my
son my wedger (axe and shaver) by them and this is my will and Testam^t
