In the Name of God Amen I James Edwards of y<sup>e</sup> County  
 Accomack in Virginia being sick in body but of good memory  
 make this to be my last will & Testament in manner following  
 following, first I give my soul to god in hopes of a blessed  
 resurrection & a full & free pardon of all my sins through  
 the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ, and my body to be decently  
 buried at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named  
 & for what I owe I hereby pledge God to pay me with I give  
 of my horse in after mentioned, first I give unto my son  
 in Law William Burton the long table & frame w<sup>th</sup> halfe  
 dozen of Leather Chairs, to be his after the Decedent's  
 his mother & also one large Bible & one of the Bibles  
 I give to John Burton my father's and mother's Bible  
 I give to Thomas Burton my father's and mother's Bible  
 my father's & mother's Bibles and a brace of rugit of a white  
 Buckitt & bristles of a white Buckitt I give to Joseph  
 Burton my great son a brace of rugit of a white  
 my coat of felt hat & a pair of Shag breeches, I give to  
 Burton a suit of Cloath lined w<sup>th</sup> red that is a coat & Shag  
 breeches & as much more rugit as will make him a jacket  
 my Casanders tools Except a hand saw a halfe inch auger  
 iron dagger an axe & a drawing knife I give to William  
 my new gun & bullet moulds I give to Jacob Burton a coat  
 of the fine Casford & my sword and my silver buckles, I give to  
 Samuel Burton w<sup>th</sup> his three & a half year for over one hundred  
 of Land lying at Gongolago next to John West also my  
 of Land formerly belonging to John West also my  
 called prime & a brace of boulders I give to my loving wife  
 a pair of Blanketts & one pillow I give to my loving wife  
 Ann the one halfe or moite of my new Sloop now in  
 Gongolago w<sup>th</sup> one halfe of all my rigging Sails & what  
 to her belongs; the other halfe of the said Sloop w<sup>th</sup> the  
 halfe of her rigging Sails & what to the said Sloop belongs  
 I give to my loving son William Burton a share in the  
 and my will is, that if any of my son William Burton should die  
 a twelve months or a year to claime this my gift after  
 decease that then I give the said halfe of my Sloop w<sup>th</sup> halfe  
 to her belonging to William Burton, & my will is that my  
 loving wife do make use & employ my Sloop for her  
 benefit, untill the said William Burton shall come within y<sup>e</sup> time  
 William Burton will be at Equall cost & charge w<sup>th</sup> his  
 mother in the putting out the said Sloop & take Equall care of  
 her y<sup>e</sup> Sloop that then he to have Equall share & profit of  
 the same during y<sup>e</sup> time before sett for William's coming  
 but if William shall neglect to assist his mother as aforesaid  
 that then my wife Ann to make what benefit she  
 can of the Sloop & take the profits thereof to her

and for all the rest or remainder of my Estate of what kind  
I give to my loving wife Ann to be hers & at her disposing She  
paying all my just debts, &c. & hereby order and appoint my wife to  
be my Executor of this my last will and Testament, to wit here set  
my hand & Seale this 14<sup>th</sup> day of January 1708:

The within last will and James Alexander  
Testament of James Alexander

& ordered to be put upon Record February y<sup>e</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> 1708

gave it and my body to the Earth from whence it came to me  
have such decent and Christian Buriall as by my Executor hereinafter  
named shall think most fitting and convenient in some of  
 certaine hope of a Joyfull resurrection unto Eternal life  
through the meritt mediation Death and passion of my Redeemer  
and Saviour Jesus Christ

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son Arthur Upshur  
my plantation where I now dwell with all the Land thereto appur-  
taining containing two thousand Acres one thousand Acres being  
formerly by me given to my son John Upshur by a Certificate  
of Gift which said Land and plantation I doe hereby give  
devise and confirme to my son Arthur and to his heirs for  
ever

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ann the now wife of  
Benjamin Dollbey three hundred Acres of Land where she now  
dwells at Naswadox and binding upon the Land of Benjamin  
Dollbey which said three hundred Acres of Land and plantation with  
appertinences I doe hereby give and devise unto my said
