 proofe and administration of the County of Accomack
 to be and to do as should be proposed in the
 purposes as is expressed by his Excellency himself and
 Maximilian hereafter of this County do wased by his
 last will and testament in writing of and made by his
 son David Gore Esq. Executor of his last will
 who at a full holden Accomack County June 17th 1696
 made himself Sub to a full that a full of 4d will my
 be granted unto him for w. cause full power & so full
 authority is here by given & granted unto him the said
 David Gore to dispose of all and singular goods rights &
 credits of & to be waded according to a true intent & meaning
 of his last will & testament expressed and to render an
 account thereof when thereunto lawfully required given
 under my hand & seal this 11th day of November 1696

In the name of God amen March 4th 1696
