That last will & Testament of John Lewis Sen.
 of Hunting Creek in y^e County of Accomack
 being of lawful Age and Sound memory at
 writing hereof and being desirous to set what
 of his Land in manner following

First - I do give and bequeath my Soul to God y^e great Creator
 and Redeemer thereof and my Body to be buried
 in decent manner at my Expence & hereafter named

Ido give and bequeath to my Son John Lewis
 all that parcel of Land in my plantation lying
 being between a small Creek or Gut called the
 great neck Gut and running along y^e main Creek to
 another small Creek or Gut where with there is a
 dam of earth made for a watering place and at
 the head of each Gut there is a tree marked with
 three marks in one side and from the trees to run
 two parallel Lines equal to the distance to run
 my Land from the Land of the Ryals and all the
 Land between within the Lines I do give and bequeath
 to my Son John Lewis and after his decease to return
 to his two Sons William and John and to their Law-
 full Heirs for ever

Ido give and bequeath to my Son Robert Lewis and to
 his Lawfull Heirs for ever all that parcel of Land lying
 and being bet^{ween} the said Land at the head of the
 of the said Gut where the said dam is for a watering place
 and y^e Land that part of my Land and the Land of
 Thomas Ryals

Ido give and bequeath to my Son Richard Lewis
 and to his Lawfull Heirs for ever all that parcel
 of Land lying and being between the aforesaid Line
 at the head of the great neck Gut and the Salt marsh
 lying over North and northwest side thereof

Ido give and bequeath to my three Sons John
 Robert and Richard all the said Land from the
 North and northwest bound of my Son Richard's
 Land to the full extent of my whole Division to be
 in common amongst them and their Heirs for ever
 so that neither of them shall claim any privilege
 in the said marsh more than the other but y^e Land
 give it to them and their Heirs for ever to be in common
 amongst them

Ido give and bequeath to my w^{ife} Lucretia
 all my moveable estate of what kind soever for and
 during her natural life and after her decease what
 estate she dies possessed of I do give and bequeath to my Son
 John Lewis on y^e condition y^e young gey mare I do give to
 my Son Richard Lewis any thing hereof to the
 contrary notwithstanding

my full and whole executor, all points to see my will duly
performed all which I doo confirm with my hand and Seale
this 15th day of August 1690

know ye that I William Sarman of Accomack County in
Virginia have bargained sold and delivered and by this
passents do bargain sell confirmed enfeoffed deliver and let
over to James Dwell Jun^r of the said County Brecklage
and to his Executors Admines or assigns for ever my
plantation where I now dwell at Timber Creek in the
said County being by estimation three hundred acres of
Land and marsh more or less bounded on the Southward
part by the sd Timber Creek westerly by John Wests
Ditch Northward by Ralph Justices Ditch and Easterly
by Wm Silverthorne his Land now in the possession of
Wm France of the said County Cover which sd Land
