in perfect health and memory Ians Deo but knowing
the uncertainty of this Transitory life doe make this
my last will and Testament revoking all wills
deeds by me formerly made Rectifying and confirming
this my only last will & Testament and is in manner
and forme following

I give and bequeath my soule to God almighty who
gave it me my body to y^e grave there to remaine
in sure and certaine hope of a blessed resurrection at
y^e last day through the merits of my blessed savior
Jesus Christ and my soule to be decently interred in a
Christian like buriall at y^e discretion of my Executors
hereafter named

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving son John Savage
one quarter part of my dividend of land whereon I now
live being three hundred and fifty acres of land to
him and to his heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving son Thomas Savage
one quarter part of my for mentioned dividend of three
hundred and fifty acres of land to him and his heirs for
ever

Item I give and bequeath to my loving son William Savage
one quarter part of my 3^d dividend of land to him
and his heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath y^e other quarter part of my 3^d
dividend of land of three hundred and fifty acres
of land to my loved son Robert Savage to him his
heirs for ever

+ and my will and desire is that my son Robert Savage
quarter part shall be where I now live to enjoy
and possess all houses orchards and pastures upon
y^e 3^d dividend adjoining to my now dwelling house

Item My will and desire is that y^e timber upon y^e 3^d
dividend of land of three hundred and fifty acres
of what quality soever shall be and continue
in comon amongst my afores^d sons John
Thomas William and Robert Savage is and
their heirs as afores^d provided alwayes that if
either of my sons should sell their quarter part
of this land to any person or persons and not to
their brothers brothers then the person or persons
shall be utterly debarr'd of any price lidge of
timber on y^e 3^d dividend but what he or they shall
purchase

Item My will and desire is that my loving wife
Dorothy Savage shall quietly and peaceably

enjoy and possess all my devident of Land houses orchards pastures etc
during her naturall life

I give and bequeath unto my loving daughter Elizabeth the wife of Robert
Watson sum^{me} one Shilling Sterling

I give and bequeath all the rest of my personall Estate to be equally
divided amongst my Children viz^t John Thomas William Robert
Mary Ann and Sarah Savages and delivered after the death of
my afores^d Loving wife Dorothy Savag she having the use thereof during
her naturall life

I doe appoint and constitute my deare and Loving wife Dorothy Savag my
whole and sole Executrix of this my Last will and testament Desire
my and requiring my good friends M^r William Nicholson and M^r
Richard Garrison to be my 3^d Estate Equally divided amongst my
afores^d Children after the death of their mother afores^d in testimony
whereof I have hereunto put my hand and seale this nineteenth of
february anno 1702
