and James Ouster which was by the Court ordered to be
put upon record Feb^r 9th 1705

Recorded March 1st 1705 by Robt. Green Esqur. (on account)

In the Name of God Amen I John Taylor of the County of Accomack
in a Colony of Virginia being weak and sick in body but of sound and perfect
Memory God Repaired for it do make and ordaine this to be my Last will
and Testament in manner and forme following viz:

I give my soul into the hands of almighty God who gave it me in due
and certaine hope of its Resurrection to eternal life by and through the
merit of Jesus Christ my only Saviour and redeemer and my body to the
ground from whence it was taken to be buried in such decent order as my
executrix shall see fit & convenient and touching my worldly Estate whereto
in his great Mercy hath lent me I give and bequeath as followeth.

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Leah Taylor all my Tract of Land
with the plantation with the appertinencies unmoveable there unto belonging
to her and her heirs after her marriage or widowhood &c &c &c
and in failure of my sd Daughter having issue I give and beleave the sd
and appertinencies unto Cornelius Johnson and his Heirs But if my sonn
John Bayley Johnson should if I shd. please God my daughter should have no
issue have any desire to this tract of Land a house named then by virtue of this
my Last will & Testament the sd Bayley my son in Law shall at the in
stant instant and Request of the sd Cornelius Johnson convey make over &
apre all that tract or part of Land unto y^e sd Cornelius as was given
unto the sd Bayley Grand father

Item I desire that immediately after her departure from her mother to
Rebecca Johnson my Daughter in Law she hath faithfully and ten
pendently her the full sum of two thousand pounds of tobacco that
is to her by her fathers death to go with her own father

Item as there is due from me to Cornelius Johnson my son in law two
hundred pounds of tobacco upon the account of his own fathers Estate my
will and desire is that he may have (to with) the sd Cornelius my son
in law my gray Horse commonly known by the name viz Bockel (twent)
hundred pounds of the sd Tobacco due from me to y^e sd Cornelius to
give him like wife my own riding Garde

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son in law Bayley Johnson four
the best Sheep he can pick out of flock of Sheep in consideration
of toll due from me unto y^e sd Bayley

Item my will and desire is that all and singular my personall
estate with that that is due from me to them my Son in law be
put into my publick stock between my wife and my daughter Leah
and my two Sons in Law Bayley and Cornelius and that they all
live together during the natural life of their Mother and my wife
and at the Expiration of that above term (or time) that if any
said Children are willing to separate from each other then y^e personall
estate Equally to be divided amongst them all this I desire to have

Item after my just debts paid and my funerall Expences defrayed
I give and bequeath unto my loving wife my plantation and
tract of Land during her widowhood and I do appoint and
ordaine my loving wife an executrix of this my last will

out of perfect sense and memory and know
that it is appointed for all flesh body and
willing to settle that little worldly estate
that y^r Lord has indid me with as followeth
first I bequeath my soule to Almighty God
who gave it hoping for salvation and my body
to the mother earth from whence it came
Item I give and bequeath unto Margaret
Foster one Iron Pot and a silver Seal
Item I give and bequeath unto Richard Foster
one Iron pot Samuell Foster to have his
choice of the potts for his daughter Margaret
Foster

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Thomas
Foster my Bible and to his Daughter and to
his Daughter Mary a sett of Silver tooth pickers

Item I give unto Susanna Sprune one Shilling
and to her husband William Sprune 10^l

Item I give and bequeath unto Francis Foster
one feather bed that he y^r sonnally lies
upon and the furniture belonging to it

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter
Anne Foster the feather bed that y^r sonnally
lye vpon my selfe with all the furniture
that belong to it

Anne Foster my table and my Chest and a
