did publish and declare in plain and express words now  
following to be his last will if he the sd Wm Milby Esq<sup>r</sup> he  
had two brothers John Milby and Joseph Milby and did give  
all that he had to them to be Equally divided between them  
and to this truth we have hereunto set our hands and sealed

I first I bequeath my soul to God that gave it hoping through his mercy  
and governing of my spirit to arrive at life everlasting and my body to have a fine  
burial at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named  
them after all my just debts first paid I give, all the rest of my  
Estate in Maderon and for me following

I give and bequeath all my part of the land have where the said  
house of this County standeth to John Sparrow the son of Thomas  
Sparrow by And his now wife and in case of his death without  
but if she lawfully begotten of his body then to go to his next  
heire at somer Lare always provided that my honde Mrs. Martha  
and his grand mother Mrs. Martha West shall have the sole  
use and benefit of the sd Land till of y<sup>e</sup> John shall attaine to  
the age of eighteen years and then he to be profited thereof  
but in case Elizabeth Late the wife and now widow of

Garwas Bagally late of this Country shall within  
six months after my decease pay to my Honored Mother  
Mrs Matilda West for & wife of the sd John Sparrow her sum  
of twelve pounds ten shillings Sterling money that then  
the sd Elizabeth shall have and enjoy the sd Land always  
provided that she keep and observe ~~the Law~~ Land to her own  
use during her life and to the heirs of her body Lawfully  
begetting and for want of such to y<sup>r</sup> g<sup>t</sup> John Sparrow and  
his heirs for ever

Item I will and bequeath the two hundred acres of Land I  
have at orsay Gingoleage to M<sup>r</sup> Thomas Weston  
and his heirs for ever provided that he make good pay-  
ment of two thousand pounds of tobacco to my Executrix  
hereafter named within eight months after my decease.

Item I give unto M<sup>r</sup> Peter Gill of London two thousand pounds  
of tobacco I have made of M<sup>r</sup> John Wickham for  
Tobacco mentioned in the sd Note being presently the  
sd Gill

Item I give my loving Sister Sarah Robinson my black  
Rorse called Jockey

Item I give to my Cosen Elizabeth Robinson Daughter  
of Tully Robinson and my g<sup>t</sup> Daughter five  
hundred pounds of tobacco to be paid her by  
her Father Tully Robinson out of what he may be  
entitled for service done him as under Sheriff

Item all my tobacco that shall appear to be due to me  
after my just debts paid I give to my honored  
Mother Mrs Matilda West

Item I give and bequeath unto my Cosen Anthony  
West Son of my Brother John West y<sup>r</sup> younger  
all the goods & Chattels Cattel &c what-  
ever shall appear by the last will and  
testament of my deceased Father Col John  
West to be delivered to him at such time  
as my Honored Mother Mrs Matilda West  
Executive of my sd father I shall think fit  
and also I give to the sd Anthony what  
broad cloth and black Drapery I now have  
to be made into clothes for him at the directions  
of his Grand mother and also one new hat  
in the custody of my Cosen Elizabeth Robinson

Item I give to my Cosen Job West Son to my  
Brother Alexander West my pistols and ~~other~~

Item I give to my Brother John West my broad  
cloth Coat Blufre breeches my Cain and  
Garde

Item my will is that my Brother Alexander  
West will pay to ~~except~~ of any other  
Coat I have that he shall have the same

Item my will is that my brother in law Tully  
Robinson I shall have his choice of my  
wings

Item I give to my Honored mother my dear  
House two eas of land for now at  
Court house and what brandy I now have

which I desire she should pay what mony debt & justly owe I also give to my  
said Mother what new Gleeson I now have & also give to my  
nominate Constitute and appoint my loving brother in Law Tully  
Johnson and my loving brother John West younger to be my hole &  
Succutors of this my last will and Testament in witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal the ninth day of November  
1700

the discretion of my wife and friends

Item I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Elizabeth  
Parker all my personall Estate of what kind soever except  
what Legacies shall be hereafter named

Item I also give unto my said Wife all my Estate of land  
and soever during her naturall life and after her Decease  
to the heire begotten by me upon her body and for want of  
such heire then to goe as followeth that is I give unto my  
sonen John Parker son to my brother George Parker and to his  
heire lawfully begotten of his body all that part of land tract  
of Land lying in the Indian town upon Pokanoke River neare  
my brother John Parkers Land being two hundred acres  
also all my part of that tract of Land (called Runn) man  
upon the sea side in Somerset County in Mary Land I give  
to my aforesaid sonen John Parker and to his heire lawfully  
begotten of his body and if my sonen Parker shoulde dy with  
such heire as aforesaid then my will is that all the aforesaid  
shall goe and fall to Bennett Parker son to my brother Ge  
Parker and to his heire for ever

Item if my wife shall dy without heire begotten by me upon her  
body and for want of such heire then I give and bequeath  
unto my sonen John Parker son to my brother John  
Parker all my Land lying in the Indian town neare the  
great bridge upon pokanoke River being by yatten fence  
hundred acres and in case my sonen John shall  
have no heire lawfully begotten of his body that the a  
foresaid Land to give to and fall to Charles Parker and

To all to whom these presents shall come & makes known  
 of the County of Accomack in Virginia aforesaid named John  
 Son Greeting in our Lord God Everlasting know ye that by  
 virtue of the Power and authority by his Excyt Edict Edmon  
 dndros King his majestys & Governe. Gen. of Virg. his Com  
 mander in his hand C. 1500d of 4<sup>th</sup> Colony bearing date the 11<sup>th</sup>  
 day of May anno Domini 1695 Empowering me to Charles  
 Scarborough for greater ease of my Inhabitants of this  
 County to sign & Seal all such Proclamations & Ordinances  
 as should be passed in Accomack County Coll and the  
 same to be effectuall to all men & purposes as if  
 passed by his Excyt him selfe and whereas John Willis  
 Coll of this County deceased did by his last Will settent  
 in writing made and signed before two witnessess & seal'd  
 his last Will and Testam. full form & purpose of a  
 Procl of his Will made & registered unto himself a full  
 copy in, before L. County 9 Oct 1695 for w<sup>r</sup>. County  
 full power & Lawfull Authority is hereby given and  
 granted unto him & Tho James Bondys & his purpos of a  
 singular goods right & credits of his late according  
 to the will & inventory of his Will & Testam. ex parte  
 therunder an account of his son the aforesaid lawfully  
 given under my hand & seal this 18<sup>th</sup> day of December anno  
 Dom 1695 Cha. Scarborough — 49

In the Name of God Amen October 22<sup>nd</sup> 1693  
 I John Rose Son & Beggar in health and perfect memory  
 thanks unto almighty God and calling to rememb'r  
 the uncertain estate of this transitory life and that  
 all flesh must yield unto death when it shall please

 in the likeness of Christ's death and passion for his  
 elect and chosen and my body to be buried in such  
 place where it shall please my executors hereafter named  
 to appoynt and allow for the settling of my Estate and  
 such Goods Chattels and debts as it shall please God  
 far above my deserts to bestow upon me also to forgive  
 and dispose of the same in manner and forme following  
 that is to say first I will that all the debts and  
 owe to any person or persons whatsoever shall be well  
 and truly paid and contented or paid in time  
 within convenient time after my decease by my exec  
 tors named item I give and bequeath unto my exec  
 tors in the first place Scarborough now and ever hereafter  
 by the name of Chas. Scarborough his executors

from a Line of marked trees running to Onancok and so down  
to Checwoodesee Creek to the mouth of the Little Field Creek so  
running up to the head of the Little Field Creek from thence  
by a line of marked Trees running to the Ridge from thence  
a line of marked trees running to the line of marked trees  
that parts Capt Geo Parker and my Land which is Southward  
bounds. also I give him two chairs and other wooden  
lumber as bed Woods with the bed and what belongeth to it  
that I now lie on. Item I give unto my Sonn William Wise  
that part of my Land that lyeth on Onancok Creek between  
Capt Geo Parker and James Bonnewell, and on the northeare  
parts by the Land of his Eldest Brother John Wise Item I  
give also boqueath unto John Wise my Second Sonn of that  
name, and usually called Johannis for distinction sake  
that part of my Land that lyeth on the Bay side on the North  
back Creek of Capt George Parkers Land and for the Eastern  
his Brother John Wise, and for the northern bounds w<sup>t</sup> a  
Creek called the Little Field Creek and from the Head of  
that Creek & by a Line of marked trees running up to the ridge  
to his Eastern line, also unto all those parts of Land above  
mentioned, which I give to my three Sons John Wise  
William Wise and Johannis above distinguished to them  
and their Lawfull issue and heirs for ever, also to the  
my Will to give and boqueath unto John Wise William  
Wise and Johannis Wise as above express and my  
Daughter Barbara Robines and my Daughter Hamlet  
Scarborough all my moveable Estate with all deathe  
is due unto me, which may be found due unto me either  
here or in England and for to be equally divided between  
three Sons and my two Daughters after my death & every  
paid and satisfied all soe I give unto my Son Thomas Taylor  
one Small Silver Tankard as a token of my love, also I  
give unto James Lee a two year old heifer for it is my  
desire that all them above mentioned may truely and  
faithfully see this my last will and Testament done and  
performed further I give unto noome Michael and  
Taylor my grand & Daughters twenty shillings apiece likewise  
them rings to ware for my Sons
