 following to be his last will &c he the 3rd Wm Milby 1st he
 had two Brothers John Milby and Joseph Milby and he give
 all that he had to them to be Equally divided between them
 and to this truth we have hereunto set our hands and Seales

 it hath pleased God in his Mercy to bestow on me doe make and
 ordaine this to be my last will and Testament revoking all other
 wills by me made

first I bequeath my soule to God that gave it hoping through the merits
 and governing of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ to buy y^e a
 glorious Resurrection among y^e just and my body to have a Christian
 buriall at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named
 after all my Just Debt first paid I give all the rest of my
 Estate in Manner and forme following
 I give and bequeath all my part of the land where the first
 house of this County standeth to John Sparrow the son of Thomas
 Sparrow by And his now wife and in case of his death with
 out issue lawfully begotten of his body then to goe to his next
 heire at common Law alwayes provide that my beloved Mother
 and his grand mother Mrs Mathilda West shall have the hole
 use and benefit of the 3rd land till y^e 3rd John shall attaine to
 the age of Eighteen yeares and then he to be possessed thereof
 but in case Elizabeth late the wife and now widow of

- Garvas Bagaly late of this County shall within
 Six months after my decease pay to my Honored Mother
 Mrs Matilda a debt for the use of the ^{3d} John Sparrow the sum
 of twelve pounds ten shillings sterling money that then
 the ^{3d} Elizabeth shall have and enjoying the ^{3d} Land and always
 provided that she keep and Relieve the ^{3d} Land to her own
 use during her life and to the heirs of her ^{3d} Lawfully
 begotten and for want of such to y^e ^{3d} John Sparrow and
 his heirs for Ever
- Item I will and bequeath the two hundred acres of Land
 I have at or my Gingoalege to Mr Thomas Preson
 and his heirs for Ever provided that he make good pay-
 ment of two thousand pounds of tobacco to my Executors
 hereafter named within eight months after my decease
- Item I give unto Mr Peter Gill of London two thousand pounds
 of tobacco I have and of Mr John West Junr for y^e
 Tobacco mentioned in the ^{3d} vote being properly the
^{3d} Gills
- Item I give my Loving Sister Sarah Robinson my Black
 Horse called Jockey
- Item I give to my Cousin Juliana Robinson Daughter
 of Tully Robinson and my God Daughter five
 hundred pounds of tobacco to be paid her by
 her father Tully Robinson out of what he may be
 indebted for service done him as under Sheriff
- Item all my tobacco that shall appear to be due to me
 after my Just debts paid I give to my Honored
 Mother Mrs Matilda West
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Cousin Anthony
 West Son of my Brother John West y^e younger
 all the goods ~~and~~ Chattels called ~~by~~ what
 ever shall appear by the last will and
 Testament of my deceased father ^{to belong to me} John
 West to be delivered to him at such time
 as my Honored Mother Mrs Matilda West
 Executrix of my ^{3d} father shall think fit
 and also I give to the ^{3d} Anthony what
 broad cloth and black Drage I now have
 to be made into clothes for him at the directions
 of his Grand mother and also one new hat
 in the Custody of my Cousin Elizabeth Robinson
- Item I give to my Cousin John West Son to my
 Brother Alexander West my pistols and ~~knives~~
- Item I give to my Brother John West my broad
 cloth Coat Stuffs breeches my Cairn and
 Saddle
- Item my will is that my Brother Alexander
 West will please to ~~except~~ of any other
 Coat I have that he shall have the same
- Item my will is that my Brother in Law Tully
 Robinson shall have his Choice of my
 wigs
- Item I give to my Honored mother my ^{Leads}
 House two Casks of boyed ^{Spice} now at y^e
 Court house and what brandy I now have

which I desire she should pay what money I justly owe I also give to my
said Mother what new Shaloon I now have
I nominate constitute and appoint my loving brother in Law Tully Robinson out of
John Robinson and my loving brother John West y^r younger to be my sole &
sole Executors of that my last will and Testament in witness where of
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seale the ninth Day of November
1700

and knowledge doe constitute and appoint this my last will and
Testament as followeth.

First I give and yeald up my my soule to God that gave it in
hope and assurance of his mercy in & through the merits of
my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ and my body to be buried by
the discretion of my wife and friends

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Elizabeth
Parker all my personall Estate of what kind soever except
what Legacies shall be hereafter named

I also give unto my said Wife all my Reall Estate of what
kind soever during her Natural life and after her decease
to the heirs begotten by me upon her body and for want of
such heirs then to goe as followeth that is I give unto my
son John Parker son to my brother George Parker and to his
heirs lawfully begotten of his body all that parcel and tract
of Land lying in the Indian town upon Pokamoke River neare
my brother John Parkers Land being two hundred acres
also all my part of that tract of Land called Rumbly marsh
upon the sea side in Summerset County in Mary Land I give
to my afores^d son John Parker and to his heirs lawfully
begotten of his body and if my s^d son John Parker should dy without
such heirs as afores^d then my will is that all the afores^d
shall goe and fall to Bennit Parker son to my brother George
Parker and to his heirs for ever

if my wife shall dy without heirs begotten by me upon her
body and for want of such heirs then I give and bequeath
unto my son John Parker son to my brother John
Parker all my Land lying in the Indian town neare the
great bridge upon pokamoke River being by pattern four
hundred acres and in case my s^d son John shall dy
without heirs lawfully begotten of his body that the afores^d
Land to goe to and fall to Charles Parker and

To all to whom this I Bont shall Comd I Charles Scaburgh
 of the County of Accomack in Virginia aforesaid Gent
 send greeting in our Lord God Everlasting Knowe that by
 vertue of the Power and authority by His Excellency
 Andros his maj^{ty} of Gov^{ty} then of Virg^{ty} his com^{ty}
 under his hand & Seale of 4th Colony bearing date 4th day
 of may ann^o Dom 1695 Impowring me & to Charles
 Scaburgh for & greater daw of 4th Inhabitants of this
 County to Signe & Seale all such Probats & Admonitions
 as should be passed in Accomack County Coll and the
 same to be effectuall to all intents & purposes as if
 passed by the Exce^{ty} him self and whereas John Wicke
 Esq^r of this County deceased did by his last Will & Testam^{ty}
 in writing Ordaine James Bonpwoe Clerk of his
 last Will and hum^{ty} Guil Bonpwoe Clerk of his
 Probats of his Will might be granted unto him a full
 full power & Lawfull Authority is hereby given and
 granted unto him & to James Bonpwoe Clerk of his
 singular & good right & Credits of his last Will
 & Testam^{ty} in writing of his Will & Testam^{ty} exp^{ly}
 & under an act & Statute of the said Colony
 given under my hand & Seale this 18th day of October
 Dom 1695

 to appoynt and now for the settling of my Estate and
 such Goods Chattels and debts as it hath pleased God
 far above my deserts to bestow upon me I do Ordaine
 and Dispose of the same in manner and forme following
 that is to say first I will that all these debts and debts
 I owe to any person or persons whatsoever shall be well
 and truly paid and contented or Ordained to be paid
 within one year and time after my decease by my Executors
 after named. Item I give and bequeath unto my Son
 John Wicke Esq^r Plantacon. now and ever hereafter
 by the Name of Esq^r some times called Plantacon
