I Joseph Clark of Accomack in Virginia being Sick and weak in Body of good and perfect memory and judgment prayed by Almighty God for the Soul and being of my self and my heirs in order and to dispose of that temporall Estate where with God Almighty gave a Power Will and Testament to be in manner and appointed this my last Will and Testament to be in manner and form following

I bequeath my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my Body to the Parish to receive such decent Christian buriall as bym Exorcism here in nominated shall be thought most fitting and convenient

I give and bequeath unto my Son in Law James Leary One Broad Cloth Coat, & One Rustian Coat & one Horse Coat & a pair of Large Crock and to my Daughter Mary his wife two pewter Dish and two pewter plates

I give and bequeath unto my two grand Sons & two grand daughters - James and daughter of the said James Leary and Mary his wife two of the on each the other will to run for a joint Stock Extension and a Mortgage my said two grand Sons & grand daughters only their Father to have every other Lam Lamb for his share in looking after them and the rest to be divided amongst my aforesaid grand Children and delivered unto each of them as they shall come to age

I give and bequeath unto my Loving Wife Ann Clark One Feather Bed and Furniture also two pewter Dish and two pewter plates

I leave the residue and remainder of my personal Estate my Debt paid and fullall Expenses discharged. I give and bequeath to be Equally divided between my wife Ann and my Son Henry And I make & appoint my said Loving Wife Ann Excecutor of this my last Will and Testament to do and to do by by annulling all former Will & Testaments by me made publick, and to show this to be my last Will & Testament in the next proof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seals this day and year first above Written

This indenture made the Twelfth day of June in the Dominion
and in the third year of the Reigne of our Sovereign Lady Ann by
the grace of God of England, Scotland France and Ireland
Queen Defender of the Faith &c. between Francis Mahonie of
Accomack County in Virginia Gent. and Naomi his Wife of the
One part and John Houston of the Same County Planter. On the
Other part Witnesseth that the Said Francis Mahonie, and Naomi
his Wife for and in Consideration of eleven thousand Seven
hundred pounds of Tobacco to them in hand at and before
bearing hand, delivery of those pounds by the aforesaid John
Houston well and truly paid the receipt whereof the Said
Francis Mahonie and Naomi his Wife doth hereby
Acknowledge them before the said fully satisfied and paid,
and thereof, and of Every part and parcel thereof doth
cheerly Acquit Exonerate and discharge the Said John Houston
his heirs, Executors and Administrators for Ever by their
sents hath given, granted, Aliened, Bargained, Sold, Enjoyned
and Confirmed, and by those sents doth fully, clearly and
absolutely, give, grant, Bargain, Sell, Aliene Enjoyn and
Confirm unto the Said John Houston his heirs and assigns for
Ever One hundred forty five Acres of Land Situate lying and
being in the County of Accomack aforesaid betwixen Bungots Bay
and Matchataunch and bounded as followeth, to wit: Beginning at
a Corner Marked Line is the Land of Mr. Robert Hutchinson,
thence by Marked Lines North West by West to point West Two
hundred and Six poles to a Corner Marked Line standing by the Mouth
of the Bay, alias Houltons Gut Thence North East Twenty eight
poles Minus Twenty Six poles to a Marked white Oak over
the Gut, Thence North East Fifty seven Degrees Seventeen poles to a
Marked Line, thence North East Thirty One Degrees Twenty four
poles to a marked white Oak, Thence North East Fifty one
Degrees Fifty two poles to a Stake near the Head of a Gut
Thence North East Eighty Degrees Seventeen and 2 poles to a
Marked Line, Thence by a Right Line of Marked Trees South
East & Easterly Two hundred and One poles to (by) a Corner
Marked Red Oak, Thence South West by South 2 points
Southward Ninety four 1/2 poles to the first Beginning, with
all and singular its Rights, Members and Appurtenances,
together with all Houses, Edifices, Buildings, Orchards Gar-
dens, Ponds, pastures, Woods, underwood, Common of
pastures and Appurtenances whatsoever unto the Said One hundred
forty five Acres of Land and premises or to any part or parcel of
them belonging or in anywise appertaining To have and to hold
the Said One hundred forty five Acres of Land and all singular
other the premises here before granted Bargained and sold with
their and Every of their Rights Members and Appurtenances what-
soever unto the Said John Houston his heirs and assigns for
Ever And the Said Francis Mahonie and Naomi his wife
for themselves and either of them their and either of their heirs
Executors and Administrators the aforesaid One hundred forty
five Acres of Land, and all and singular other the premises
before granted Bargained and sold with the Appurtenances unto
the Said John Houston his heirs and assigns to the Only proper
use and behoof of the Said John Houston his heirs and assigns
for Ever Against him the Said Francis Mahonie and Naomi his
wife them or either of them, their or either of their heirs
and assigns and all and singular every other person or persons
whatsoever Lawfully (Claiming by from or under them or any
of them shall and will Warrant and for Ever Defend by these
sents, and the Said Francis Mahonie and Naomi his wife
for them selves and either of them, their and either of
their heirs Executors & Administrators do Covenant

promise grant and agree to and with the said John Houston his heirs and assigns and every of them by these presents that the said John Houston his heirs and assigns and every of them shall and may by force and virtue of these presents, from time to time, and at all times, for ever hereafter lawfully peaceably and quietly have hold, use occupy possess and enjoy the said One hundred forty five Acres of Land, and all and singular the before granted premises with their and every of their Right, Members and Appurtenances, and have receive and take the Rents, Groves and profits thereof to his and their own proper use and behoof, for ever, with out any Lawfull Lett Subj. Trouble Disturbance, Interruption, Eviction or Disturbance of the said Francis Makemie and Naomi his Wife them or either of them, their or either of their heirs or assigns or any other person or persons whatsoever Lawfully their Act, Consent, Title Interest Privilege Or procurement, Debts and Services, which from hence forth from time to time shall be promised Only Excepted and forewarned In Witness whereof we have hereunto set our hand and Seals the Day and Year first above written

To all to whom these Presents shall come I Thomas Mills of Accomack County in the Colony of Virginia send greeting: Know ye that I the said Thomas Mills for and in consideration of Two thousand Seven hundred and fifty pounds of Good Tobacco in Cash to me in hand paid and received by my loving brother Edward Mills of the County aforesaid: Whereof I and Aliens, Sold, Assigned, Delivered and Conveyed; and hereby to be known, give, Grant, Bargains, Sell, Aliens, Enforce and Convey, To the aforesaid Edward Mills One hundred and twelve Acres and a half of the Land I bought of William Jarman of this County as according to Conveyance of said Land does appear the aforesaid One hundred and twelve Acres of Land and a half as aforesaid being bounden upon the Land of Thomas Mills and upon the branch by Griffin Savage: Together with all woods, Trees, wood Appurtenances whatsoever to the said One hundred and twelve Acres and a half of Land so long as or in any wise Appertaining, To the said and to the aforesaid Edward Mills, his heirs and assigns for ever freely and clearly discharged of and from all manner of former debts, gifts, Grants, Bargains, and Sales whatsoever and I the said Thomas Mills for my self, my Heirs, Executors, Administrators, Debtors, Covenant, Promises and Grant to and with my aforesaid Brother Edward Mills his heirs and assigns by these Presents; that he the said Edward Mills his heirs and assigns shall lawfully, Have Hold, use, occupy, Possess and enjoy, the aforesaid Bargains, and Sell Premises, and
