This Indenture made the third day of October Anno Domini 1704 in y^e third year of y^e Reigne of our Sovereign Lord King by the Grace of God of England Scotland France and Ireland Queen Defender of the Faith &c. Between E. B. Bole of Suffolk County in England Esquire of the one part and John Parker of the County of Suffolk in Virginia on y^e other part Witnesseth that y^e said Edward Bole for and in consideration of ten thousand pounds of Tobacco and Casque to him in y^e at and before y^e sealing and delivering of these presents by the aforesaid John Parker well and truly paid the Receipt whereof fully paid Edward Parker doth hereby Acknowledge himselfe there with fully satisfied and paid and thereof paid of Every part and parcel thereof doth clearly Acquit Exonerate and discharge y^e said John Parker his heirs Executors and Administrators for ever by this Indenture hath given granted Allowed Bargained Sold Enjoined and Confirmed and by these presents doth fully Release and absolutely give grant Bargain Sell Allow Enjoine and Confirm unto the said John Parker his heirs and Assignes for ever two hundred Acres of Land more or less which said Parcel of Land was by deed of gift given to the said Edward Parker by his father John Parker as also said deed Acknowledged in open Court holden 20th 1693 with the Counters thereof Expressly with all and singular its Rights Members and Appurtenances together with all house Offices buildings Orchard, Gardens, fences pastures Woods Underwoods Common of pastures and Appurtenances whatsoever
