I shew all men by these presents that Elizabeth Scarborough
 Lawfull wife of Edmund Scarborough of County of Accomack
 in Virginia Gent^l Do make, ordaine constitute and appoint
 John Washbourne of y^e same place Carke my true and
 Lawfull attorney for me and in my name & stead to acknowledge
 in Accomack County Court these several and Respective (one of y^e same)
 & each of Land Given Granted aliened and sold by y^e said
 Edmund Scarborough my now husband to y^e sundry & respective
 persons hereinafter mentoned exp^{re}ssly & specifically viz
 Given to y^e said Daughter Urrula his now wife of Capt Richard, Eight
 one hundred and Eighty acres of Land to Henry Staker sold Two
 hundred and eight acres of Land to Thomas Dickinson one hundred
 acres of Land to Henry Lurton Sixty three acres of Land to James
 Cary ninety five acres of Land to John Simck one hundred
 fifty acres of Land and to Reynold Badger one hundred and
 fifty acres of Land in all nine hundred thirty one acres of Land
