witnesseth that the said William White for and in consideration of
Twelve hundred pounds of good tobacco & Cash the receipt where of
the said Richard Rogers acknowledges and of every part and parcel thereof do for
ever acquit exonerate and discharge the said Richard Rogers his heirs
Executors and Administrators have given granted alienated Bargained
sold assigned Enfeoffed confirmed and delivered like as by these
present words given Grant assign Bargained sold assigned Enfeoffed confirmed
he deliver unto the said Richard Rogers his heirs and Assignors for ever
a parcel of Land Situate lying & being in the County of Accomack
aforesaid at the head of great Kuspatocks other wise called Indian
Creek containing one hundred Acres Beginning at the main Creek
and bounded at the head between two branches for the breadth and the
length between the aforesaid two branches Eastward unto the
water for length to make up & complete the aforesaid Quantity of
one hundred acres of Land formerly in the possession & Occupation of
William Chapin since deceased the said one hundred Acres of Land being
the one moiety or half part of a dividend of land of the said
Acres formerly given & granted unto the said John Rowles to have
and to hold the said one hundred Acres of Land together with all
Houses Buildings Orchards Gardens fens, pastures, Marshes
woods hyatts & Rivers with all profits Commodities what so ever belon-
ging with all other appurtenances with the hereditaments unto the said
Richard Rogers and to his heirs & Assignors for ever in as full &
ample Manner to all intents & purposes as by virtue of any Grant
could have been gotten warrant or warranting unto the said
Richard Rogers & to his heirs & Assignors for ever quiet &
peaceable possession of the said one hundred Acres of Land
from the Claims trouble or Molestation of any the said William
White my heirs Executors & Administrators: So that was nor any
