 with this marke *RWS* and one large silver wine Cupp
 and one glass case which hangs now in y^e hall and
 one Coach which is now in y^e hall Chamber and one
 mans Riding saddle that was his fathers and
 halfe my Roggs

And in Like manner I give to my son David Watson
 one purple Chest which was my son John Watsons and
 halfe my Roggs to have and Enjoy Immediately after my
 death

And in Like manner as aforesaid I give unto my Grand
 son John Watson one Cow called *Pe face* and her
 Increase as with my hand and seal y^e 2 day of December
 1704 further I give to my Granddaughter Sarah Scott one
 new darke Colored George gowne and nine or ten yards
 of new stuff I give unto my daughter in Law David Watson
 Wife all my every day weavering Cloth and one gowne
 which I used to make of a violet Colled George as witness
 my hand as before

Watts of y^e County Gent. y^e receipt whereof I doe hereby acknowledge have given granted bargained & sold by these presents do give grant bargain and sell unto y^e John Watts his Exec^r & Adm^r one mare grey Coloured Marked thus  to have & to hold y^e Mare & her Increase unto y^e John Watts his Exec^r & Adm^r to & for y^e severall uses hereafter limited expressed & declared that is to say to and for y^e only use and behoofe of y^e Rebecca Bunting during y^e terme of her naturall life and after her decease to and for y^e only use of Tobias Bull the naturall son of y^e Rebecca Bunting his Exec^r Adm^r & assigns for ever and to and for none other use intent or purpose whatsoever In Witness whereof I y^e Edmund Scarburgh have hereunto set my hand & seal the seven & twentieth day of December Anno Dom 1704
