In y^e Name of God Amen I Phylor fisher of accomack
County in Virginia being now of a sick and weak
condition but of perfect memory blessed be God for
the same but uncertain of my continuance in the
world doe make and ordaine this my last will and
Testament in manner and forme following
first and principally I commend my soule to the hands
of Almighty God hoping for salvation only through
the merits and intercession of Christ Jesus my Lord &
saviour and my body I commit to y^e earth to be decently
buried at y^e discretion of my executrix hereafter named
and as touching my temporall Estate as it hath pleased
God to bestow on me I give and dispose of as followeth
first I will that all my just debts be paid and discharged
secondly I will that my son John fisher shall have my gun
& no more of my Estate
thirdly I give unto my wife daughter Ann James a Cow and
keffer one pewter dish when she marry
fourthly I give unto my daughter Mary fisher two featherbeds and
sterniture Olivish pulled Purkins and Red Rugg with
blankets and sheets also foure head of cattle and
a pewter dish when she comes to age
fifthly I give unto my daughter Elizabeth fisher one feather
bed and blankets and bolster and foure head of cattle
that is three Cows and one steer the 3^d Mary the
like cattle and Elizabeth a pewter dish
sixthly I give unto my son Phillor fisher foure head of cattle
and a hors folt when he comes to age att sixteen
years old to be clear for himselfe
seventhly I give unto my son Bally fisher foure head of
cattle and five sheep when he comes to age at
sixteen years old to be clear for himselfe
eightly I give all the remaining part of my Estate
my wife Elizabeth fisher both good and Chattels
of what nature or kind soever
ninthly I doe ordaine constitute and appoint my 3^d wife
whale executrix of this my last will and Testament
making voyd and of none effect all other will
tenthly I will that all the above cattle be given to my
afore 3^d children forthwith before they come to
age and that they to goe to be in my marsh untill they
come to age and there in frease

lastly I doe desire and appoint Robert Brimmer William Lucas Jener John Morris and John Johnson to be as trustees to the performance of this my last will given under my hand and Seale this seventeenth day of February 1708

The within last will and Testament of Philip Fisher was proved in open Court of Accomack County by the oaths of John Morris and William Lucas which was ordered to be put upon Record June 9th 1709

In the Name of God Amen March 9th 28th Annoq Domini 1708 I James Smith of Accomack in Virginia being at this present time being of perfect health and Memory Thanks be to almighty God and Calling to Remembrance the uncertainty of this Life as Transitory and that all flesh must yeeld to Death when it shall please God to call I doe make Consistible and declare this to be my Last will and Testament annulling and revoking by this present all and every Testament and Testament with and without Revocation by me made or declared in word or writing and this is to be taken for my Last will and Testament and none other first being penitent and sorry from the bottom of my heart for my sins past most humbly desiring forgiveness for y^e same I give and Commit my Soul to almighty God my Saviour and Redeemer in whom and by the merits of Jesus Christ I trust and believe assuredly to be saved and to have full pardon and Remission of my sins and that my Soul with my body at y^e General Day of Resurrection shall rise againe with joy and blisfull memory of Christ shall and passon prosper and inherit the Kingdom of Heaven prepared for his Chosen and Chosen and my body to y^e earth to be buried with decent buriall and now for the settling of my Temporal Estate of what goods Chattels and Debts as shall please God I doe give my Assets to bestow upon one I doe give order and dispose of y^e same in manner and forme following That is to say I will that all these Debts which I owe in right or Confession to any manner of person or persons whatsoever shall be well and truly paid and paid or ordained within convenient time after my death by my Executory hereafter named whom I will and my desire is to give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Smith the plantation that I now live on being a about ninety acres more or less to him and his heirs for ever Item I give and bequeath unto my son John Smith a tract of Land being two hundred acres by latter called Addition being in Mary land adjoining on y^e head of Swanagoct Creek unto him and his heirs for ever Item I give and bequeath unto my son James Smith a tract of Land being three hundred acres by latter called Lakefield adjoining upon y^e same Land given to my son John Smith and upon y^e same Creek unto him and his heirs for ever Item I will give and bequeath unto my three sons Thomas Smith John Smith and James Smith a tract of Land being nine hundred and four acres upon Assalage Island to have Equall parts alike where Thomas Willman now liveth to have precisely a like in the now pasture with them and their heirs for ever Item my will and desire is for my son Thomas Smith to have prevelidge for himselfe he shall occasion for his owne use upon either of his Brothers Land John Smith or James Smith Item I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Smith one set of Smiths Tools Item I give unto my son John Smith one set of Cooper Tools Item I give unto my son James Smith one set of Carpenters Tools Item I give unto my son James Smith one pair of hand millstones and a leader frame to it Item I give unto my Daughter Deborah Smith one feather bed and furniture Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Joyce Smith one feather bed and furniture Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sumford Smith one feather and furniture Item I give unto my well beloved wife Ellinor Smith one feather bed and furniture Item I give unto my wife Planer Smith one iron pot holding Season gallons during her life and after to my son Thomas Smith then to have y^e rest of them I give and bequeath unto my son John Smith one three gallon pot Item I give and bequeath unto my son James Smith one five gallon pot Item I give unto my Daughter Director Smith one iron Kettle holding one gallon Item I give unto my Daughter Joyce a Copper Kettle holding twelve gallons Item I give unto my son
