 now plantation containing two hundred acres of land with all houses
 and fencing lying and being at the head of Oranock Branch being
 Northernly to Richard Cutler's Land & Easterly bounded to the said
 belonging to the said John West Dec^d the said Land I give unto my
 her heirs assignes for ever and eight head of Hogs one head of cattle
 one bay mare one iron pot and one pair of Hott Rooke eight Gallons
 of brandy in two Cask and four gallons of brandy six new Cask
 ten yards or thereabouts of Virginia flax at Richard Cutler's and the
 rest of my household goods December 4th 1708
