 County of Accomack with kin names send Greeting 85
 Know ye that I y^e Elizabeth Bagwell of my owne
 free & voluntary will without any Compulsion have
 remitt^d releasd and for ever quit Claimed like as by these
 presents do freely & voluntarily remitt^d & releasd unto
 Peter Burnley his heirs & assigns for ever all my Right
 Claim Title & Interest as y^e Elizabeth Bagwell
 now have or may hereafter have for or by reason of
 dower third at Common Law in or to one hundred acres
 of Land assigned & sold by my hus band the^r Thomas
 Bagwell according to y^e Tenure of y^e within deed of
 bargain & Sale so that neither I nor no other in my
 name shall or may at any time hereafter have any Claim
 any right title or Interest in or to y^e said Land or premises
 or in any part or parcel thereof but that that wee
 every of us shall for ever hereafter by these presents be
 excluded and Debarred in witness whereof I have here
