 at Virginia and after for and during term of eight years to serve in such
 service and employment as the said Walter Bryce or his assigns shall
 there employ him according to the custom of the country in the like
 kind. In consideration whereof the said Walter Bryce doth hereby
 covenant and grant to and with the said Darby Bryon to pay for
 passage, and to find and allow meat, drink apparel and lodging with
 other necessaries during the said term, and at the end of y^e term
 to pay unto him the usual allowance according to the custom of the
 country in the like kind. In witness whereof the parties above
 mentioned to these Indentures have interchangedably set their hands
 the Day and year first above written.

 Ireland Defenders of the Faith &c Between Charles Harrison and
 Matilda his wife of the County of Accomack in Virginia of the
 one part, and Daniel Darby of the same place Planter of the
 part Witnesseth that the said Charles Harrison and Matilda
 his wife for and in consideration of three thousand pounds of
 Tobacco and cash to them in hand at and before the sealing and
 delivery of these presents by y^e said Daniel Darby well and
 truly paid the Receipt whereof the said Charles Harrison doth
 hereby acknowledge and therein fully satisfied and paid and
 acquit exonerate and discharged the said Daniel Darby full
 given granted aliened Bargained sold conveyed and confirmed
 grant Bargained sold alien conveyed and confirmed with the
 Daniel Darby his heirs and assigns for ever a certain piece or
 parcel of Land situate lying and being in the County of Accomack
 aforesaid at the head of a creek known as Beech containing one hundred
 acres of Land and bounded as followeth Beginning at a marked
 black gum in the Branch, thence north east & by north two hundred
 twenty one paces to a marked Hickory thence by a Line of marked
 trees South westerly Eighty four degrees one hundred fifty eight
 paces to Red oak, thence South one hundred twenty eight paces thence
 East by north thirty eight paces thence South and by East forty six
 paces to y^e first boundary by a Plot and survey thereof made by
