Virginia in and upon the good ship called the *Ann*
of London - which of us master under God for this
present voyage George Nantow - and now riding
at anchor in York River in Virginia and by Gods
grace bound for London - to say eight hundred
of Virginia Leaf Tobacco - being marked and
numbered as in the margin and are to be delivered
in the like good order and well conditioned at the
aforesaid Port of London (the danger of the Seas only
excepted) unto me Jonathan Manners of London
merch^t - or to his assigns his or their paying Freight
for the said Goods Eleven pence four farthings
per Tun with Prime and average a customed
Inwards whereof the Master or Tinner of the
said ship hath assigned to three Bills of
Lading all of this tenor and date: the one of
which three Bills being accomplished, the
other two to stand void. And so God send the
good ship to her desired Port in safety Amen

myself and health, but of perfect memory, praiseth to
God to commit my soul to the hands of my heavenly
Father and my body to be buried according to the
will of my Executors.

I have given and bequeathed unto my Son John Purvis One
hundred and four years old Capt on the 1st of Jan^y 1699
under Will on the 1st of Jan^y 1699 with all her female mercs
until he shall arrive at the age of sixteen years
and then the said Will and all her future profits
male and female to him the aforesaid John and his heirs

Right, privilege, profit, commodities or services
 and or may in any way be conveyed or passing to
 or parcel of the said lands made over by the
 person said to be given during the life of the
 first we give him all such part of our pasture as may
 be within a fence beginning at the East end
 of the Orchard and running straight to a small tree
 in a point secondly we give all the South East end
 of the Orchard beginning at the North end
 of the Old dwelling house where the fence
 begins, running North East or there about to the
 Orchard including heavily bearing trees Apples
 together with all other trees therein contained or making
 also give all such land as yett South or by from the
 bounds of the pasture or Orchard and all such land
 between our Orchard or any part of our leased
 and the Southmost end of the above said two hundred
 Acres of land with all Rights and privileges of
 and full liberty of Pasture or some other kind to
 it or any other land he hath or shall have of or any
 of the said two hundred Acres of land and for the
 strengthening and the truly performing of the
 premises jointly and severally we the aforesaid Thomas
 and Elizabeth his wife have hereunto set our hands and
 this thirteenth day of January One thousand Six hundred
 Ninety three. Signed

Know all men by these presents that I Thomas Jones of
 the County of Augusta in Virginia Planter do give and
 am fully indebted unto Richard Sturges of the County
 aforesaid Planter to him his heirs Executors and assigns
 and full him and quantity of two hundred thousand pounds of
 good sound Moreportable Tobacco and Cash to contain
 the same conveniently on the Day next in the foresaid
 County upon all demands, and for the well and truly
 payest thereof I do by these presents give my self and
 heirs and assigns fully at witness my hand this thirteenth
 day of January One thousand Six hundred Ninety three Signed

The Condition of this Obligation is such that if the above
 bound Thomas Jones and Elizabeth his wife do at all
 times perform and Inviolably keep all such covenants
 and conditions made over to Richard Sturges his heirs Executors and
 assigns in a deed bearing date the thirteenth day of January One
 thousand Six hundred Ninety three Signed Thomas Jones
 and Elizabeth jointly and severally the foresaid deed charging the
 said Thomas Jones and Elizabeth, then this Obligation to be
