I will that all gifts that I own in right or otherwise to any person or place
wherefore be it hereby my duly discharged and done to any person or place
my dwelling house called and known by the name of Pinchbeck and which
is bounded by Dibuton street, Saville street, and Right and Cedar streets being
upon the North side of Third street in Accomack County in the Colony of Virginia
shall be leave in the custody and under the management of my Executor Mary Brinner
the minor until my sons, Lewis and Edward shall arrive at the age of twenty
and following and those who do live and bequeath the same unto them to be sold
and divided among them. Lewis (be) & Edward my loving John Brinner the
minor a part or share of the land (one) hundred and twenty five acres when he
shall arrive at the full age of Twenty One Years, unto my son Samuel Brinner
also my son Edward and Twenty five Eighty acres part of my said tract of land
when he shall arrive at the full age of Twenty one Years, and unto my youngest
son Robert Brinner take one hundred and twenty eight acres being the remaining
part of the before said tract of land together with a good dwelling house there
unto and immediately after the death of his mother my aforesaid Executor and then
to be sold and enjoyed by him the said Robert his heirs and assigns for ever the
whole tract or parcels above so bequeathed equally divided to all before any
of them shall have got the same or more of any other part of the said tract of land
and bequeath that part of acreage of land for heirs of both the said sons
and bequeath part of the bequeathed parcels or portions unto the survivor or survivors to be
left and divided among them or them the survivor or survivors and if at
any time before the death of any of them should they be unable to sell
the same and bequeath the same unto any daughter Mary Brinner a to be
sold and enjoyed by her or her lawful heirs or assigns for ever
I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Brinner the best Bed in my
house and chamber unto my daughter Mary Brinner the best Bed in my
dwelling house together with the bedding thereto belonging. To Robert of
my son Robert his bed that shall belong to him a spinning wheel for spinning wool, a
spinning wheel for spinning cotton, one Hand mill with the accompanying thereto
two Milch Cows and two kids together with all their future increase all in their
full and entire possession and to be the right and property of the said Mary and
Robert joint together and then be the right and property of the said Mary and

Robert for ever to be divided equally between the aforesaid
them to give and bequeath 6 Cows to be divided equally between the aforesaid
sons or such of them as shall survive their mother my executors with
all their future increase immediately at her death.

my son Robert Brinner and do request my loving son James King,
Rice Bray, and John White (son in law to the said Mary) to be his assistants.

that I mark Ewell of Accomack County in Virginia have for a valuable conve-
nient in land regaird Langford and sold and by these presents I with Alien Langford
in force and confirms unto William Darter of the same County a parcel
of land containing thirty acres lying and being in the County aforesaid and bounded
between timber Creek and Gilford bounded on the north side with the marsh
land of Wm Darter and on the west with the land and marsh of Ralph Just
and on the South and East with the land of marsh Ewell formerly the land of
Ralph Ewell and taking a equal breadth from Ralph Just his fine to th Just's
Ewell his fine formerly the land of Wm Darter to make the complement of thirty
acres which land to be marked Ewell I will firmly set over to the said William
Darter and to his heirs for ever all rights and privileges to the said thirtys
acres of land further for my self my heirs and assigns for ever with warren
and warrantray unto the said William Darter and his heirs for ever quiete a
peaceable possession of the aforesaid land free from the trouble or molestast
of any person what ever that shall ask challenging or demand in or to the
same but from all rights better we intrust or demand in or to the
said land or estate or actions or any by from or from or
