First & Act  
In the name of God Queen of England Scotland  
France & Ireland Defend<sup>r</sup> of the faith &c. To Richard  
Drummond Gent<sup>r</sup> Commiss<sup>r</sup> of the County of Accomack  
Authorise & appoint you to be Sheriff of Accomack  
County during our pleasure and that you be accordingly  
sworne as soon as conveniently can be and before  
you be admitted to the Office of Sheriff of the said County  
you enter into bond before our Justices of  
the peace of the said County with good and sufficient  
Security in the sum of One hundred thousand  
Pounds of tobacco to your Heirs and Successors to render  
unto my Auditor Byrd or such other as shall be appointed  
by us to receive the same & a particular perfect and full  
account of all our Revenues and dues in the same County  
during the time of your Sheriffalty. And also that you  
make due payment & make of all such Publick dues arising  
to be levied in the afores<sup>d</sup> County of Accomack unto the  
several persons that shall be appointed to receive the  
same with full performance & make of all things belonging  
to the use of the Sheriff of the afores<sup>d</sup> County. And  
so hereby commanding all our Officers both Civil and Military  
and all other our Subjects that are inhabiting the said  
County and others Deputy there to be adm<sup>d</sup> & assist  
you the said Richard Drummond as Sheriff in all  
things relating to the Office of Sheriff of the afores<sup>d</sup>  
County. Witness our trusty and well beloved Francis  
Nicholson Esq<sup>r</sup> our Lieut<sup>r</sup> and Governor generall of our Colonies  
and Dominion of Virgin<sup>y</sup> at the City of Williamsburgh  
Under the Seal of our Colony the 24<sup>th</sup> Day of August  
1703 in the second year of our Reigne

In the name of God Amen These presents witnesseth  
that I Robert W<sup>m</sup> Hutchinson of Accomack in the County of  
Accomack being weak of body but in perfect sense and  
memory made and ordained this my last Will and Testament  
in form and manner following.

First I bequeath my soul unto Almighty God who formed  
it trusting that through the merits of my blessed Saviour  
Christ Jesus to enjoy everlasting life with him in his heaven

Madame Also I bequeath my body to the earth to be decently burthen  
buried by my named Executrix and for the world to take that  
path pleased by the Lord to endue me with I give and bequeath in manner  
and form following.

- Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son Robert half of his Devideed of Land Lying  
Four hundred Acres the part that now lye upon with all orchards  
Houseing and fencing thereunto belonging to him and his heirs for ever.
- Item. I give unto my Son David the other halfe of the same devideed with all  
the orchards houseing and fencing thereunto belonging to him and his  
heirs for ever.
- Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son in Law Samuel Benson and Joanna  
his wife two hundred Acres of Land lying on the other side of the Roff  
branch or spratts branch commonly so called to them and their heirs  
for ever.
- Item. I give unto my Grandson John Benson one hundred Acres of Land  
belonging unto the devideed given unto his father Samuel Benson  
and another Quantite to him and his heirs for ever.
- Item. I give my gilt and what belongs to it to my Son Robert and my Son  
David equally to be Devideed between them.
- Item. I give and bequeath all my tools to be equally devideed between my  
Son Robert and my Son David.
- Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son Robert one pair of Silver Lee buckles  
and one pair of Sodpis Buttons the buckles marked with FE the buttons  
marked with FC.
- Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son Robert my black coat.
- Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son David my new Millstones and and  
iron work thereunto belonging.
- Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son David one paire of Lee buckles and a paire  
of Silver Buttons.
- Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son David the gun that he now hath  
in possession.
- Item. I give and bequeath unto my Grandson John Benson the gun  
that was called his fathers
- Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son in Law Samuel Benson two pieces  
of the guns that I have left except the field gun and long gun unto  
him and Grandson Benson a haire of cotton wavy and thickens.
- Item. I give and bequeath unto my Grandson John Benson the gun  
the holsters and back parts.
- Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Joanna my fine French lace.
- Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son David and my brother Peter all  
my wearing cloaths sonably to be divided betwixt them.
- Item. All the rest of my Estate living and bequeath unto my Son Robert  
during her life and after her decease to be bequeath devideed  
amongst my four daughters viz Mary Elighton and Susanna  
Scott Sarah Kettam and Joanna Benson except my daughter  
Sarah and furniture which I bequeath unto my Son David.
- My will and desire is that my Son in Law George Scott should have  
my Negro Peeter in his share.

I nominate institute and appoynt my Lawfull wife to be wchc  
and Executrix of this my last will Testament.

My desire is that my Son Robert shall be to the performance of  
this my last will and Testament.

My desire is that immediately after my decease my son Robert  
cause an inventory to be taken of my Estate.

And in performance of this my last will and Testament I have  
hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this twenty fourth day  
of July One thousand seven hundred and two.

Francis Darbie and John Watson saith that being at the  
plantation of Robert Watson deceased were called into  
the said house and the said Watson caused us to be called into  
to be witness to his will & said Darbie made answer I can  
no longer write nor read the said Watson answered yet you may  
for I think this will be the last will that I shall make  
whereupon I did set my mark to it. John Watson did not  
my name; we both having heard the will read, but did  
neither sign it. Said not signed by the said Robert Watson  
and the said Darbie and Watson asked whether the will  
was sealed when they did witness it, they both made answer  
to the best of their knowledge they saw no seal on it, but  
when we had witnessed it the said Watson gave the will to  
his wife saying this is my last will & testament for I think this will  
be the last will that I shall make.

To all Christian people to whome this present  
writing shall come Knowne by that I Geris Dagge alias  
or Accomack County in Virginia a man Smith by Name  
of goodnesse and Consideration me thereunto in my  
but more especially for the sum of Ten pounds Sterling  
money to me in hand paid by Nehemiah Jones of the  
Kingdom of England the receipt whereof I do have & do  
acknowledege and do acquit and discharge him and  
his heirs &c for the same have given granted sold  
and confirmed onto the said Nehemiah Jones and to  
his heirs and Assignes for ever one Lot or half Acre  
of Land situate lying and being in Town Begh port Town  
of Accomack in Accomack County Bounding North West  
at Duncacock in Accomack County Bounding South thence by two  
on the Market place and running from thence by two  
parallel lines drawn South East Six degrees East by  
West pole and bounded on the South & West by West Street  
and running thence by two parallel lines drawn  
North East three degrees & forty five minutes eight poles  
to have and to hold the said one half acre of land  
according to the mens and bounds expressed and set downe  
and one Dwelling House and One Smale house formerly a  
Dwelling house now standing on the said half acre of land  
together with all other rights or immunitiess pertaining  
to the said half acre of land to him the said Nehemiah Jones  
his heirs executors and Assignes for ever see that I the said  
Geris Dagge and my heires and all manner of persons  
having & to come or hereafter shall be for ever  
excluded and debarrred and that the said Nehemiah Jones and  
his heires and Assignes shall for ever have hold and seaseall  
enjoy the said Land and immunitiess according to the true intent  
and meaning of the said Deed of Sale & Indenture made
