In the name of God almighty this 6th day of March
1696 I Thomas Baye esq; of Accomack County in Virginia
old man or being easel and weak in body but of
perfect sound and memory praised be God for I do
make and ordain this my last Will and testament
in manner and form following

Item I bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God
my maker hoping that through the merit of his
death and passio[n] of Jesus Christ my only saviour
and Redemer to receive free pardon and forgiveness
of all my sins and as for my body I give it to the
dearne[m] mother the Earth from whence I came
and leaving Christian Burial at the discretion of
my loving wife and executors hereafter named

Item I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth my wife
the house and plantation where I now live for
and during her naturall life the same land to
contain one hundred acres of land beginning
at the plantation where I dwell by Portions bound
running northerly up unto the head of a long by John
Roger's plantation no a lways provided that if my son
Edward shall be of age before his mother doth die that
then he shall have and enjoy one equal part of the said
land to seat and build upon provided always he shall
not disturb his mother of the said plantation now and
she lives on a[n] of my son Edward should marry
before her death it shall have the benefit of half
of the orchard fruit & shall have liberty to manufacture
or get lumber or what else necessary & convenient
to make a plantation and if my son Edward wife Elizabeth
die then the whole plantation going one hundred
acres aforesaid I give to my son Edward him his heirs
or assignes for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas one
plantation containing one hundred acres of land
where David Alcock now lies and lying and bound
northerly on the north side of the Dry Swamp th[is]t
hundred acres of land I give unto my son Thomas
his heirs or assignes for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my son James one
hundred acres of land lying and bounded on the south
side of the Dry Swamp running towards Burtons Branch
and running south west to Capt Wm Justis Land and
West up to the Dry Swamp th[is]t land I do give to
my son James his heirs and assignes for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughters and
wife all my inviolable estate to be equally apportioned
amongst them to them and their Heirs or assignes
for ever and that my daughters shall be alwa

at Sixteen years old a Clergyman shall my 3 daughters shall have their equal shares or sooner if they be married & for the attaining to sixteen years of age

John It is my will and desire that my said Sons Edward & James
and James shall remain w^t my wife during her widowhood
untill they attaine the full age of twenty one y^r each, but if
my should marry that then my sed Sons to be at age of
Eighteen y^rare

Lastly I do nominate and appomte and ordaine my young
wife Elizabeth my whole and sole Executrix of this my
last Will and Testament ordering her to pay all my debts and
funerall charges as before mentioned revoking and recalling all
other wills, deeds of gifts and Testaments by me hitherto
made or nominated to Bernad J. Connelly and Edmund Hill,
to Berny last Will and Testament and in witness whereof
set my hand and seal this sixth day of March anno Dom
1693

To all to whom these Presents shall come I the Scarburgh of
County of Accomack in Virginia aforesaid do send Greeting
from my Lord God Everlasting know by Seal by virtue of the
Power & authority by his Excellency Edmund Andros Esq; the
Majestie of England Governor Genl of Virginia his Commissioner
his hand and the Seal of the Colony bearing date the 11th
day of May anno Domini 1695 for powring and chasid
Chancery Seal for the greater safety of the Inhabitants
of this County to Signe and Seal all such Proclamations and
Administracions as shall be passed in Accomack County till
the same be or effectuall to all intents and purposes
passed by his Excellency himself and others as Thomas
and Edward of this County deceased did by his last will
written in writing before me and appomt his
wife Eliza Beth Solt Executrix of his said last will
who at a Court held in Accomack County June 4 1698
made humboldt Solt Esq; to be a Probat of the
will which be granted unto her for which cause
full power and lawfull authority is hereby given
and granted unto her the said Eliza B.
