 god for the same calling unto me the uncertainty of this frail life  
 knowing it is appointed for all men once to die do make thy my self  
 Will and Testamēt in manner and forme following that is to say  
 first and principally I commit my soule to God that gave it and to my  
 body I committe to earth to be buried in such decent order as my execution  
 hereafter named shall receive the same againe by the mighty power  
 of god and as touching my body liberte wherewithal is left p[er]petuall  
 to god me in this life I give I devise and bequeath in manner and  
 forme following

To my son

I give and bequeath unto my loving sonne Samuel Brittingham the  
 plantation whereon he now dwelleth the said land belonging to the said  
 plantation being upon a Gut leading out of Pitt Creek along the said  
 to a stone field fence to a great Gunne tree and so to my head  
 line bounding my son John Brittingham Land and mine

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Brittingham  
 during her widow hood one third part of the Land and plantation  
 wherein I now dwelle with one third of it orchard & house thereon  
 and the other two thirds therest I give unto my son Nathaniel  
 Brittingham unto whom also after my aforesaid wifes marriage  
 or Deceas I give that third part of my aforesaid land and plantation  
 in this Cloufey of my wile given and left to my aforesaid wife  
 for that after her marriage or Death my said son Nathaniel  
 to have the whole to him and his heirs lawfully begotten for  
 ever but in case of the Death of my said son Nathaniel  
 I leave no such heires as aforesay then my will is that my son  
 Samuell Brittingham have and enjoy the said Land & plantation  
 whereon I now live to him and his heirs for ever

To my son

I give and bequeath unto my son Nathaniel Brittingham one  
 negroe boy named Jeffry one large feather bed with stand  
 in the merchants Chamber with boulders hugg one pair of shub  
 bed Head Belonging thereto one Chest of drawes and long table with  
 the chaires that stand there also with all the Chaires with  
 over the Day one great iron pott all my wearing Cloath except  
 my black suit which I give to my son Joseph Brittingham  
 one paire of pistols and holsters one gun all my carring and  
 Tanners tools one young Gray mare

To my son

I give and bequeath to my loving child Rebecca Brittingham one  
 feather bed and furniture and waincett chest one iron pott to  
 a parcell of land where william Brittingham bin & litle had  
 upon being by estimation one hundred and fifty acres more  
 less to her the said Rebecca Brittingham and the heires of her  
 body lawfully begotten also I give and bequeath unto my  
 daughter Rebecca three Cows & three Heifers and one son Pittie  
 and three heifers

To my son

I give and bequeath unto my son william Brittingham one  
 hundred acres of land lying and being in sumerset County  
 part of a doverend or tract of land containeing seven hundred  
 acres called winter quarter to him and his heirs for ever

To my son

I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph Brittingham two hundred  
 acres of land lying and being in sumerset County in Maryland  
 being part of the soundend of severn hundred acres there  
 called winter quarter to him and his heirs lawfully by her  
 executors

To my son

I give and bequeath unto my aforesaid son Samuel Brittingham  
 one hundred acres of land lying and being in sumerset  
 County in Maryland being the remainder part being of  
 my aforesaid tract of severn hundred acres of land  
 called winter quarter to him and his heirs for ever

To my son

I give and bequeath unto my son Nathaniel Brittingham  
 also a great Chest also of handmills not to be removed  
 I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Brittingham  
 all the personall Estate which I had with her at the  
 time of our mariage be it of what kind soever  
 in lawne Spetia

To my son

I give unto my loving son william Brittingham three Stile  
 leather Hides and three copper leather Hides it being as a fort  
 for lawne arm further right to a

part of my Estate than what I have mentioned  
Item to give unto my Loving Son John Brittingham three sole leather hides and three  
other Leather hides it being as a Bar to Catt him the said John for laying any claim  
to any part of my Estate to any part of my Estate unto my Loving Daughter Sarah Horsay five Shillings  
Item to give and Bequeath unto my Son John Brittingham five Shillings  
Item to give and Bequeath unto my Loving Son in Law Mr. Francis Thorrowgood the Morality or  
one halfe part of my piece of Land lying over Against the Lancing of the  
Plantation wheron I now Dwell lying and being in Sommersett County to him his  
heires or Assignes for ever  
Item to give the other halfe of my above to wife of March unto my Loving Son  
Nathaniel Brittingham to him his heires or Assignes for ever  
Item and for all the rest and remainder of my Cattle but at a ready Begreded Exceptin  
six hds of Young Horses with I give and Bequeath unto my Loving Daughter Ann Thorrowgood  
the remaing cattle to remaine on the Plantation for the good and better suff  
ort of my Loving wife Mary Brittingham my Loving son Nathaniel Brittingham  
and my Daughter Rebecca Brittingham and also the hogg belonging to the  
Plantation to give unto my Loving wife Mary Brittingham and my Young  
Daughter Rebecca Brittingham and my son Nathaniel Brittingham for  
the better Support of the Families above laid  
Item and for all Hogg now running on this plantation to remaine for at the abo  
we mentioned Cattle hogg be it for the better Support of the family as aforesaid  
nestined with out Division or removal of the plantation  
Item and for all provision of what nature and kind soever now on the plantation  
remaine for y<sup>e</sup> better Support of the family as aforesaid mentioned  
Item I give and Bequeath unto my Loving Son Samuel Brittingham five sole leather  
hides and five copper Leather hds  
Item I give and Bequeath all the rest of my personall Estate but of what nature  
soever unto my two Sons Samuel Brittingham Nathaniel Brittingham  
and my Daughter Rebecca Brittingham to be Equally divided Between my  
two Son and Daughter to them and their heirs for ever  
and of the my Last will and Testament I make Ordaine Constitute and  
Loving wife Mary Brittingham and my Loving Son in Law Mr. Francis  
Thorrowgood my full and whole Executors & Executrix there by making will  
and will all former wills by me made ratifying and Confirming this will  
none other to be my Last will and Testament In witness whereof I do  
hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year aforesaid written

one lord wheron I q<sup>t</sup> said Brittingham now dwelleth upon to him & to his  
Brittingham his heires and Assignes
