 his Honor whom the said Custis setteth forth that being once
 and God almighty for some yeares past having been pleased to
 visit him with extraordinary violent sickness in so much that in his
 own judgment and the opinion of most others that saw him he
 could not live; and altho' it hath pleased God in some measure to
 restore his health; yet is he sometimes afflicted with very violent
 fits so such a degree that were not extraordinary care taken
 him in them he should be in great danger and for that by his
 disability and the failure of his memory and hearing he is
 unable to performe the duty required of him in the performance of
 the severall offices and places he now enjoyeth, he most humbly
 prayeth that he might be discharged from them being desirous
 to spend the remainder of his dayes in a retired life after the
 advice thereof his Honor's Lieut Gov^r desired the opinion of
 friends therein who acquainted his Honor had all along faithfully
 and diligently discharged his duty in y^e severall places and
 offices he had been honored with and in the last unhappy
 troubles in y^e yeare 1676 was very diligent and active in the
 discharge of his duty to y^e then present King Charles the second of great
 industry and was in a very high degree serviceable to y^e King
 and to many Loyal Gentlemen in particular but
 having pleased God for some yeares to visit him with
 sickness which hath caused him to be very weak and
 yet afflicted with very violent fits one of which may be
 expected in a small time will carry him out of this world
 about being evident that his memory and hearing are
 decayed and of opinion that his Honor's petition may be
 on Consideration whereof it is also that his Honor is very
 during his time of his being in this government he had
 discharged his duty and likewise well knowing the said
 indisposition of y^e Esq^r with his advice and consent of his Maj^{ties}
 Council hath for the future discharged the said Custis from his
 attendance at Hon^{rs} Courts and Councils till such time as
 he known therein and from all other publick places & offices
 whatsoever the said Custis clearing his ships he hath already
 entered) and their most gracious Maj^{ties} are humbly supplicating
 to take the said Custis his petition into their Royal Consideration
 and grant the same

 whom these presents shall come greeting, Whereas by Royal Letters
 bearing date the 24th of June 1696 bearing date at Westminster the
 first day of March in the fourth year of his Majesty's reign, there is given
 and granted unto me full power and authority, to constitute and appoint
 Justices and in Cases requisite Commissioners of Oyer and Terminer Justices of
 the Peace Justices and other necessary Officers and Ministers within this
 County for the Administration of Justice and putting the Laws in Execution
 and to administer such Oath or Oaths as are usually given for the execution
 and performance of Officers and places and for the hearing of such matters
 as shall be assigned to you John West William Justin Edmund George
 George Nicholas Park Richard Baily Thomas Washbourne Edmund Justis
 George Parker John Broadhurst John West Curchemson William Parker and
 Edward Moore your Justices and Justices and every one of you in them so
 far as the power for Accomack County and to keep or cause to be kept the
 Statutes of England and Laws of this Country made for the good
 of the peace and for the conservation of the same and for the quiet and
 Government of the people in all and every the Articles matters and
 things according to the force form and effect of the same and to punish
 through all persons offending against the force of these Statutes and
 Laws and to cause to come before you or any of them in the County a person
 threaten any of his Majesty's Laws proper either in their bodies or
 towards one's servants or to find sufficient security for the peace and good
 behavior of such persons and to keep and all his people and if they
 refuse to do so then to cause them to be kept in custody for
 four or more of years, whereas any of you John West William Justin
 Edmund George Nicholas Park Richard Baily have been and come
 at the usual place of holding Courts in the County aforesaid at certain
 according to Law to hear and determine all suits and controversies
 partly and partly during the term what to Justice Appertaineth according
 to the Laws of England and this Country with full power taken for you in
 every of you to take depositions and examinations upon oath for the
 manifestation of the truth of all such matters and causes and to give
 cause to be kept all Orders of Court Orders of Council and proclamations
 directed to you or coming to your hands from me and the Council and
 me to punish the offenders and breakers of the same according to the
 Laws of England and this Country and further to keep or cause the
 Court to keep Records of all Judgments and other orders and
 decrees given by you or any four or more of you whereas any of you

 that you diligently intend the doing of the peaceable things
 and laws of this County and all and singular other the premises
 to be done of these presents Command and the Sheriff of the County
 Accomack shall at their own charges and places which they shall
