In the Name of God Amen I Ruth Ann Hosque being sick & weak in body but think to God for it having my last will & Testament first giving a desire to dispose of my worldly Estate as followeth (viz) first I give my Soul to almighty god who gave it me & my body to w: Earth to be buried Christian like manner Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter in Law Elizabeth Hill of best state of Cloathing I have a young Petticoat Apron & Hankie for her Item I give to my daughter Barbara Blear two of my best Ruggs Item I give to my daughter Ann Hosque a good Redd Rugg Smoothing Iron & Hatchet and my gray mare & first Colt of the mairg I give to my daughter Ruth Hosque a Bridle I give to my Grandson Clark Bleare one Silver shilliball to Ann Hosque; Item I give to my daughter Sarah Hosque my horse Buck and Bridle & saddle & bridle Spur more Item I give to my best daughter Edred & Colster & one negro Slave called Sam & give to my son Simon Hosque & all the nails of I have drawing knife ad & Hammer; Item I give to my son in Law Henry Blear two thousand pounds of tobacco for to put my son Simon Hosque to School two years Righting & Leparing & to keep my son at School two years out Item I give to my son in Law John Hosque one Cow Colf my wairing Cloathing to be Equally divided amongst my three Daughters Barbara Ann & Sarah Hosque & Elizabeth Bell to divide my Cloathing among my Daughter, Item I give all the Remainder of my Estate to be equally divided between my three daughters & in Proportions for Clark Blear and I desire my two friends William Bell & Nathaniel Bell to divide my Estate between my three daughter, & my Grand Son Clark Blear I publish this to be my Last will & Testament Revoking all other wills & Testaments whatsoever I make or do in Law Henry Blear my sole Executor of this my Last will & Testament in w: year of our Lord 1720 Sept 27 day
